Washington State Antique Vehicle License Plate Specifications by Year.

This Information is Also Valid for Current Licensing With an Antique Plate.

1905 to 1915 A number was assigned & the owner was responsible for making his own License "Plate" of wood, metal, or leather, with numbers painted or fastened on. It was either carried or the number could be stenciled in the front and rear of the vehicle.

In 1916 the first metal plates were issued & the applicants were furnished with temporary cardboard plates & the metal plates were then mailed from Olympia.

1916 to 1920 were issued on a March to March basis.

Plates up to the very early 1930's were designated a passenger car by an "x", trucks by a large "T", and public-owned cars

If you are licensing your antique vehicle with an antique plate you must have the restored plate with you • have at least one Washington plate the same year as vehicle the only exception is the preceding year because plates were not issued for that year Vehicle must be more than 30 years old & in good running order & used primarily for testing & driving others for pleasure without payment • may not be used on replicas or carry any load or used for any commercial purpose, or be used like a regular license plate entitling the operator to full use of the hiway in the same manner.

 The use of these plates have a one-time lifetime fee. • The vehicle registration use class is RES • They are filed by TPO numbers, title & TPO options are selected, & the restored license plate # is recorded in the Equipment Number box. Refer to page 5404-Specialized Plates - Vehic. Registrat. The Club Secretary will have all info on this subject for T Club members to use.


