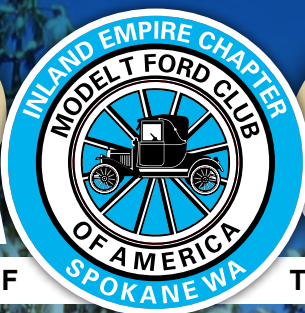

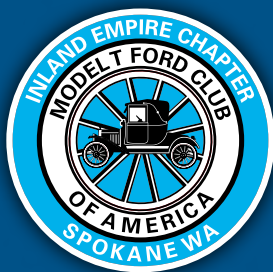

Minutes from the Last Club Meeting

February 7, 2020

President Steve Heid called the meeting to order at 7:37 p.m.

➔ **Minutes:** The minutes from the December meeting were approved as printed in the *Fender Chatter*.

➔ **Treasurer's Report:** Karma Roth was at home sick—barely able to speak. Nan Robison gave an abbreviated Treasurer's Report, which was approved as read.

➔ **Sunshine Report:** Susie Carnegie passed along the message that she had sent no cards so far this month, and just a couple from last month as reported in the *Fender Chatter*.

➔ **Tour Reports:** Mike Robison will be running the annual Safe-T Inspection at the Skidmores' on Sunday, May 17th. Norma said that this is the last year that we have windshield stickers for. A motion to purchase 10 more years worth of stickers was tabled when it came up during discussion that 25 stickers per year might not be enough, since our club membership is increasing. Norma will get a price quote before we make a decision about how many stickers to purchase.

Tour Chairman Matt Hansen called on Gene Kicha to talk about his January 1st Tour. About 60 people enjoyed lunch at Timber Creek. While there were approximately 12 Model T's that made it for lunch, only about 8 continued on to tour up Argonne and along the river in what was perfect weather for January 1st. Stories were told, pictures were taken...a great tour!

We have no tours planned in February yet.

Jim Patterson asked if there was any interest in a late winter/early spring antique shopping tour, possibly starting in the Garland District this year, and it appears that if he plans it, we will come.

Betty Patterson received thank yous and a round of applause for this year's banquet. There was good food, good entertainment, and real utensils—although the meat was so tender that plastic would have worked this year!

Matt reported on the 2020 National Tour in July. We have received 106 registrations and have 211 people coming—pretty good for the first month. Two-thirds of the rooms at Northern Quest are booked. We have people coming from as far away as Florida, Virginia, and even a couple from New Zealand. Our next planning meeting is Monday, February 24. We will need help parking cars and getting organized. If you can volunteer for an hour or two, it would really be appreciated. Myron Richardson, in particular, is planning the tour on Monday, July 20th and will be parking the cars in McEuen Park in Coeur d'Alene. He anticipates that he might need as many as 12 people to help, since we will be traveling along pedestrian pathways to park on the grass.

We have opened a second Tour Account at Banner Bank because Global Credit Union charges a fee to cash checks from Canada that do not pass through a bank in the United States, and we have received some of these checks from people registering for the National Tour. It is intended that the new account at Banner will only be used to cash Canadian checks, and then the money will be transferred to the original Tour Account at Global. Also, all of the bank accounts at Global have been put in the names of the current officers.

➔ **Old Business:** none

➔ **New Business:** Carla Carnegie is planning a Game Day on Sunday, March 8th at 3 p.m. at Willow Song, E. 21101 Wellesley, Suite 102, Otis Orchards, WA. Bring finger food and a game to play to shake off that cabin fever.

Jim Patterson and Rose Hodges are working on the roster. **Roster update forms must be in before March 1st.**

Vice President Ralph Brevik is looking for ideas and help for the T Club swap meet booth in July. Norma Skidmore announced that we should "expect some fun things" this year, as it will be the V8 Club's 50th Swap Meet.

Steve Heid brought up that **50% of our club members also need to be members of the MTFCA** in order to qualify for liability insurance. We are currently **only at about 45%**. Steve mentioned two things to consider: You must be a member of the MTFCA to register for the National Tour. Also, it is required that the club officers be members of the MTFCA. A motion was made that the club pay the MTFCA membership fee for the officers, as they put in time and effort to help to the club. During discussion, it was brought up that other committee chairs also put in extra time—especially the *Fender Chatter* editor. But then it was also discussed that while the officers are required to be MTFCA members, the other committee chairs are not. The motion was amended and was approved as follows: The Inland Empire Chapter will pay the MTFCA membership dues for the current President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer if any of those officers request that this be done.

Brooks Johnson is still hosting our club library.

Tom Kite needs help building the rear-end for his 1917 T.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:18.

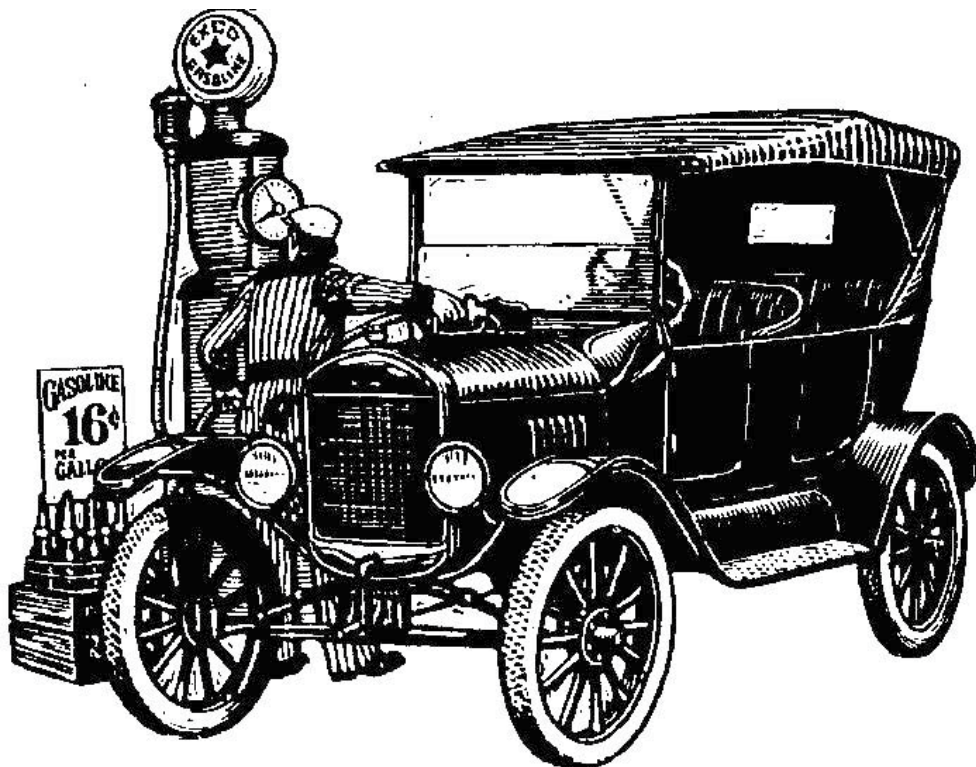


REICHERT, Donald W. "Don" Born on August 26, 1930 as the only child to Walter and Francis Reichert in Spokane. Don attended Finch Elementary and North Central High school. Following High he school attended the University of Washington where he met and married his loving wife of 65 years, Florence LeCocq. Shortly thereafter, Don was drafted into the Navy during the Korean conflict where he saw active combat along the North Korean coast serving on a destroyer. Following the Navy, Don joined his father and they together ran "Walt's" Tire Shop on 4th and Walnut until his retirement. Don grew up with summers on Priest Lake and eventually had a family cabin outside of Coolin, where his three daughters also spent their summers. Antique and old cars were his passion of which he had many, all of which looked like they just came off the show room floor. He and Florence were charter members of the Model T club and also members of the Hassie club. Don loved his family and friends and always had a "cold one" in his fridge or in a cooler in the trunk of his antique cars. Following his retirement,

he and Florence moved to Florence, OR for warmer weather and RVing. They returned to Spokane in July 2012 Don is preceded in death by his parents, Walter and Francis Reichert, daughter Robin and wife Florence. He is survived by his daughters, Rayleen Knight, Becky Chamberlain, numerous grand and great-grandchildren. Please send any memorials to SCRAPs. 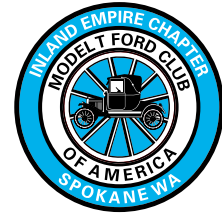

Please join us in beautiful Eastern Washington! We will be touring to all points of the compass and the city center to give you a sample of the diverse landscapes found here. On most days there will be optional things to do, which you can choose from depending on your interests. Lunches will be provided when we are visiting rural areas. Tour Highlights In-Brief:

Friday, July 17: Early Registration will be open from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. You may pick up your tour packets and have the whole day on Saturday to explore places we will not be able to get to on our tour days. We will have some great suggestions for you!

Saturday, July 18: Our Registration Desk will open at 10 a.m. for you to pick up your packets. The rest of the day you may explore on your own: visit our Hospitality Room, take advantage of the many amenities that Northern Quest has to offer, or find information about other sites to visit at the Registration Desk. Don't miss the Ice Cream Social Saturday evening—it will be a special treat!

Sunday, July 19: We travel **North** to the orchards of Green Bluff. A look at the Green Bluff Growers Map will give you an idea of the many things to do during our visit. The more adventurous may wish to drive up to 6,000 foot Mount Spokane for a look at the view from the top, but the tour will follow beautiful country roads through evergreen forests at a lower altitude.

Monday, July 20: We will head **East** and spend a day in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho on the shores of Lake Coeur d'Alene. Enjoy a dip in the lake, a walk along the boardwalk, shopping, and great food options. If you want to play the Coeur d'Alene Resort's golf course and test yourself against the famous Floating Green, you will have to set-up your own tee time.

Tuesday, July 21: We'll work our way **South**, where glacial lakes drained and left behind sand dune-like rolling hills that are the richest land in the country for growing wheat, barley, chickpeas, and lentils. We'll stop to smell the roses along the way, and have lunch in the college town of Cheney, home of the Eastern Washington University Eagles and their famous bright red football field.

Wednesday, July 22: It's to the **West**, where the land is more what one would expect of our high desert locale. The West Plains are the eastern edge of the channeled scablands scoured out by great floods during the last Ice Age, and we will be traveling through them to historic Fort Spokane, with lovely views of the Columbia River on our return trip.

Thursday, July 23: We make the short trip into **downtown** Spokane to follow the City Drive, a tour of some of Spokane's historic places. There are too many to stop and see them all, but we will give you enough information so that you can pick out your favorites to visit. Don't lose track of time—Northern Quest puts on a banquet buffet that you won't want to miss!

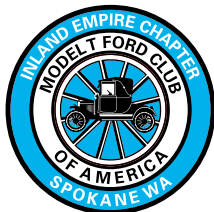

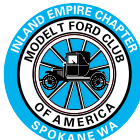

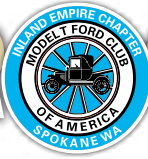
