

Blast from the Past

The Spokane Model T Club at 50

Learned wisdom from the 1998 MTFCA National Tour our club hosted that Summer. A reprint from the November 1998 issue of *Fender Chatter*. Marith McCoul, Editor.

LESSONS I LEARNED AT THE 1998 WESTERN NATIONAL MODEL T TOUR

By Harvey Dunham

- Spark plug gap is 28 or 30 or 32 depending on who you talk to.
- You can't drive onto the trailer when you have 2 gallons or less in the gas tank.
- Don't let your tank get less than half full or it will vapor lock.
- Bent rear wheels will cause wear on the front tires.
- The toe-in should be set at 3/16th of an inch
- If the toe-in is not set right, the rubber will peel right off your tires.
- Put the top down before entering a trailer which is not high enough for the top.
- New Day timers are best.
- New Day timers are from the box can't be installed without a modification to change the timing - otherwise the engine will kick you.
- Roller timers are better than New Day timers.
- Old New Day timers (brown ones) are better than new ones (black ones).
- Run on battery and it will not burn out your coil points.
- Run on battery all the time as we do in Australia
- A "T" is not made to run on battery it should be started on battery - than run on magneto because you get more voltage.

Yes, poor Harvey was riding with Tim Hein who had a shorted wire on the bottom of his coil box. In the course of that harrowing week, they heard the wisdom of most of the 50 states and a few foreign countries. No wonder he's confused. When you break down, I recommend cutting eye holes in a sack, putting it over your head, then telling everybody it has a Chevy engine in it.... - Ed (Jepperson)


