

Spokane Model T Club at 50! T Assembly Teams


The Model T Assembly Competitions - by Jeff Hipp

Did You Know the Spokane Model T Club started the Model T Assembly craze?

The more recent demonstrations we did were in the 1990s and a few in 2007-08. But, did you know that it was actually started in 1967 by former club member, Grant Lundin? Grant, owner of Antique Auto Ranch, decided one day to see how long it would take to assemble a running Model T from a pile of parts. That event is described below by Carla (Grant's daughter)...








The idea was to show off this T assembly stunt at the very first Spokane Swap Meet (1967) that was held out at Fairchild AFB. The crew on that first put-together was Grant Lundin, his twin brother Clair Lundin, Dick Bergen, and Dave Nicholson. There may have been one more guy who helped in some way, but I don't remember a name. Practices were held at Antique Auto Ranch.

During the first practice attempt, I watched as the T was assembled and started. It then took off on its own down the driveway, and it turned itself to the right at the end of the drive, and ran head-on into a car turning into Antique Auto! That was an amazing event to watch!

At the swap meet T assembly show, one of the cute touches was at the end when one dude threw a shovel full of "spare" parts that were still lying on the ground into the back of the assembled T. Then the guys all piled in and on the T to ride away down the drive.



It seems there may have also been a Spokesman-Review reporter and camera man present at the 1967 first show, and it may have made it on TV-we didn't have a TV, so I can't verify that." - Carla Carnegie

The idea was revived in 1994 after Grant told this story at one of our T Club meetings. After getting a car pieced together, and many practices, our first demostration was at the July 1994 Spokane Swap Meet (old south lawn stage) with men's and women's teams.

The challenge was to basically assemble a complete chassis, engine, body, fenders, radiator, and running boards, and then start up the T,

and drive foreward & back. It's pretty much a stock chassis with a few minor modifications. There was also a set of official rules made, but they haven't been located at the time of this article.

The following excerpts are taken from the Aug. 1994 & Aug. 1995 Fender Chatter by Club Newsletter Editor, Marith McCoul... The 1994 women's team consisted of Carla Carnegie, Margaret Sills, Tammy Hipp, Nan Robison, and Anna Carnegie. Nan managed to take the injury award with one bad fall (she slipped on a loose wiring harness) plus she smashed a finger (luckily, not too serous) while trying to line up the drive shaft with the transmission. Unfortunately, Mita Overmire had planned (and trained) to be on the team but an illness a couple of days before the swap meet prevented her from taking part, so Anna stepped in to help out.

The men's 1994 team consisted of Rick Carnegie, Jeff Hipp, Mark Hutchinson, Erik Hutchinson, and Jim Patterson. The injuries were split as the men couldn't let the women outdo them, so Mark accepted the smashed finger award while Jim did the tripping and falling routine!

Both teams were coached and advised by the grandfather of the sport, Grant Lundin, whose 1967 team accomplished the same task (but without body and fenders) in 4:14! Many other Spokane T Club members contributed time or parts to help make this a fun and successful event!

The popularity grew to the 1995 Swap Meet. The women's team this year was Carla Carnegie, Anna Carnegie, Marjorie Hipp, Tammy Hipp, Margaret Sills, and Mita Overmier. The men's team was Rick Carnegie, Jeff Hipp, Mark Hutchinson, Erik Hutchinson, Dennis Secaur, and Jim Patterson.


1995 Women's team - June 1996 Fender Chatter

competition between the various clubs participating in the Labor Day Speedster Runs! There was even mention about making this an annual event at future MTFCA National meets!

Hosting the 1998 MTFCA National Tour

The Spokane T Club had several more competitions during the next few years, with different club members joining in. One of the last assemblies our club did in the 1990s was at the MTFCA National Tour that we hosted in 1998. The Spokane team was Rick Carnegie, Jim Patterson, Mark Hutchinson, Erik Hutchinson, Jeff Hipp, and Dave Robison. The international men's competition resulted with the top three times all **within 8 seconds** of each other! Australia took 1st place at 1:43, Riverside-Corona CA Chapter took 2nd, and Spokane took 3rd with 1:51*. *all-time Spokane record

After 1998, finding time for a team to practice was difficult, and Spokane club interest started to really drop off. **There was a revival** of the Spokane T Club T Assemblies in 2007-2008 with coed teams (official times cannot be located). Per Erik Hutchinson, "In 07-08 we did the assembly exhibitions where they put us in a forgotten corner of the Spokane swap meet. Nobody seemed to really care. Not even our own club. So we basically just did it for ourselves. It was fun though".




