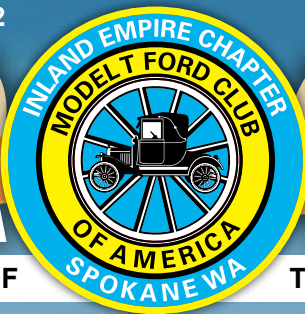

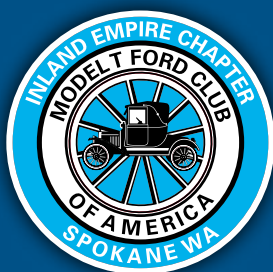

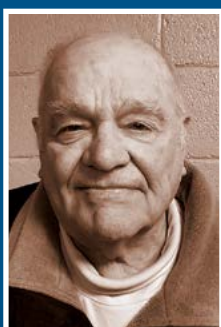

Minutes for the Friday, November 4, 2022 Meeting

President Ralph Brevik called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. There were no new members or guests. The minutes from the October meeting were approved as printed in the *Fender Chatter*.

➔ **Treasurer:** Karma Roth's report was approved as presented. Karma asked everyone to please fill out a Roster Update Form even if none of your information has changed. This will make it easier for her record keeping as she will have current information.

➔ **Sunshine:** There was no Sunshine report, but we send best wishes to Jim Sills, Jim Patterson, and Pat Johnson.

➔ **Tours:** Jim and Betty Patterson said that ten people attended the coil seminar, some that we haven't met before. Everyone introduced themselves, told what they have for T's and how they got started in Model T's, which was a great way to learn a little about our new members. Thank you from Jim and Betty to Mark Hutchinson for helping. Thank you from everyone who attended to Betty for providing a wonderful lunch and to Jim for having a coil seminar!

Tour Committee Chair Nan Robison went through the list of Model T Club activities that people could participate in this year: High Tea, Safety Inspection, Driving School, the Montana 500, National Tour in Wisconsin, Swap Meet, Moore-Turner Heritage Gardens Tour, Economy Run, August Club Picnic and Tour around Saltse Flats, Spokane Fair, and a Coil Seminar. A few of the tours they had planned didn't happen, but perhaps they can be rescheduled for next year.

Nan will be having a meeting in January or February to plan for next year. This meeting is open to everyone. Please come and share your ideas, or if you can't make the meeting share your ideas with someone who will be there. It was mentioned that we haven't done a parade for a long time. Tom Carnegie and Myron Richardson had proposed a hill climb that didn't make it into 2022's plans.
