Minutes from the Last Club Meeting


June 3, 2016



THE NATIONAL-BODIED MODEL T

For car enthusiasts that haven't yet been to the LeMay America's Car Museum in Tacoma - it's well worth the visit! We were there in early April, and among the 4 floors of hundreds of historic automobiles and exhibits was this 1919 Model T Touring with a National body. Here is what the signs had to say about it: "Henry Ford commissioned the National Body Company to build 80 bodies for his Model T automobiles. His target market was doctors and lawyers and professional people that wanted to be able to say they drove a Model T like everyone else, but wanted something just a litle bit nicer. The result was a much more substantial and stylish body than your average Model T. Of the 80, only 2 Touring (or 4-passenger convertible) bodies were built. The second one was documented as having been destroyed in the World War II scrap drive making this example the one survivor. This vehicle also has the distinction of being fully restored by the craftsman of Evergreen Historic Automobiles". — submitted by Jeff Hipp

A Rip Van Winkle Model T Story

This is a recent local story about a Model T Ford that literally had been lost for thirty years. By "lost", I mean it was totally forgotten about and sat in a commercial rental/storage facility with no knowledge of any living person as to its whereabouts. – and no one was paying any of the accumulating storage fees on it.

About two months ago, I received a phone call from Lee Burgess about a lady whom he had just talked to from Coeur d'Alene concerning a 1919 Model T Touring that she and her now deceased and divorced ex-husband once jointly owned.

Lee referred the lady, Gloria Culver, to me as he thought I might be interested in helping her get the Model T running again after 30 years of latency.

But this was just the beginning of the story - - - - -

A week or so later, Lee and I went over to Coeur d'Alene to see this car and sure enough, stuck into the very back of a 30 ft. deep storage garage was a 1919 Model T Touring, with four totally flat tires, an extremely corroded-up battery, and covered with 30 years of dust and dirt (about 1/8 inch deep). Other than the obvious age related problems, the T looked extremely good, being in very good restored condition. Excellent paint and upholstery, and great shape body wise. Since the tires were flat, we couldn't push or pull the car out at that time, so we shut the garage up and Gloria took both of us out to lunch where we started questioning her on the Model T's history.

Back in the early 1980's, Gloria and her husband belonged to the Spokane T Club and they both worked on the T and personally restored it in a Hayden Lake auto body shop owned by her husband.

She remembers the Storeys, the Schmidts, the Davis', the Whiteley's, and several others T Club families. They drove their T around and took part in some Model T Club tours in the 1984 – 85 era. In 1986, she and her husband went through a divorce, and the divorce decree gave her

husband their house and the Model T and several other classic cars went to her. Her now "ex" husband agreed to store the T for her since she no longer had a garage to store it in. Several years later her "ex" passed away and when she went to retrieve the T, it wasn't in the garage, and no one knew anything about its where-abouts. No title or registration paperwork could be found. She assumed it had been sold over the years and all traceability lost, so she reluctantly forgot about ever getting it back, especially under the circumstances of not having any storage available for it.

Fast forward 30 years to the year 2016.

Gloria gets a call from an old friend, a retired Kootney County Sherriff's Deputy, who knew of her love for old cars and also knew of her "lost" car. He had seen a wantad in the local newspaper describing an old car that was being auctioned off by a local commercial storage business to pay off years of accumulated unpaid storage fees. Her friend suggested that she check out the old car being advertised, and as fate would have it, it turned out to be her long lost and forgotten Model T! She then coughed up \$6,100.00 to pay for the storage fees to get the car back.

About 2 weeks passed, and Gloria got hold of Antique Auto Ranch in Spokane and asked if they could get the car running again, as she wanted to take it out for a ride. She isn't capable of driving it at this time, because of a recent hip joint replacement, but she wanted to go for a ride in it just the same. Jim and Gloria took the car to a friend's home where they hand washed and scrubbed it

a second time to get the years of accumulated dust and caked-on dirt off. Mike at Antique Auto did his magic and got it running in a little over a day's time by installing a new battery, taking up a couple rod bearings, installing a new radiator, adding some gas, and adjusting some other minor things. It started up easily and ran beautifully! After some more consideration, Gloria decided to coin the name "Rip Van Winkle Model T" for her car since it had come back to life after 30 years of not running or even being thought of.



She is now hoping to get her T out for touring this summer and anticipates getting a close friend and his teenage children to learn to drive her around and join the club on tours. I'm sure she would appreciate any volunteer T Club drivers, so if interested, give her a call.
