So again a very large thank you to all the T member that came out to support this cause.

Spice of Life:

CHILI (taken from a Betty Crocker cookbook)

Makes 24 servings I broke it down for 2 people. Submitted by Sandy Dyers

4 lbs. ground beef

chopped onions (about 4 cups)

4 cans(1lb. 12 oz. each can) tomatoes (can be any kind-but crushed is preferred.)

4 cans(15 & 1/2 oz each) kidney beans (I use the real or canned small red bean)

2 tbs. sugar 1 can (15 oz.) tomato sauce

3 tbs. chili powder

1 tbs plus 1 & 1/2 tsp. salt

Cook and stir ground beef and onion in large roasting pan until meat is brown and onion is tender. Drain off fat. Stir in tomatoes, liquid from beans, tomato sauce and seasonings. Heat to boiling.

Reduce heat, simmer uncovered 1 hour and 15 min. Stir in beans and simmer for about 30 min. or until desired consistency. Add some chili seasoning mix (to taste and maybe a bit more sugar - according to your taste)

FOR TWO PEOPLE

1 lb. ground beef 1 cup chopped onions 1 can tomatoes 1 can small red beans small can of tomato sauce 1 tbs. sugar 3/4 tbs. chili powder Salt to taste. Mix as per directions above.

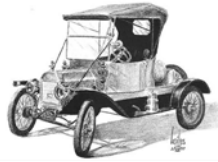


Medical Lakes Founders Day Parade

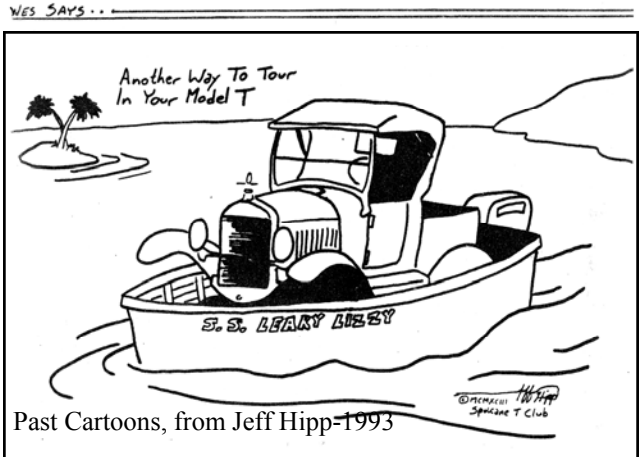
