



Minutes from the Last Club Meeting

June 2, 2017

President Mark Hutchinson called the meeting to order at 7:37 PM.

• Treasurer's Report:

Betty Patterson handed out the June 2017 Financial Statement a motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the report.

Secretary's Report:

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the minutes from the May meeting after Tom Carnegie made a correction from the use of the word guitar to ukulele.

Charitable Contributions Committee Report:

continued from last month...The Ford Alberta Sawmill

When Jim Patterson and brother-in-law, Jack Cartee, went back to the Upper Peninsula of Michigan last April, they had an opportunity to see first-hand, the restored Alberta saw mill owned and operated by the Ford Motor Company, which was 100% dedicated to Ford automotive wood components production. Wood pieces produced included all of the wood frame and exterior pieces used in all Fords from the 1922 Model T's through the early 50's woody era cars, ending with last of the woodies in 1954. These Ford dedicated saw mills were spotted throughout the Upper Peninsula of Michigan and each was a complete specially built Ford town centered around the saw mills, but complete with nice company owned residential housing, stores, theaters, churches, and schools for the Ford workers and their families. The UP (Upper Peninsula of Michigan) is famously known for their brutally hard winters with several feet of snow accumulations annually, making the primitive dirt roads through the forests un-usable during the long cold winters, thus, the need to build towns wherever the forested conditions and ice / snow conditions allowed. The sawmills actually produced at higher levels of production in the winter because large hardwood tree logs several feet in diameter were much easier to pull on the frozen lakes and icy roads by teams of horses or an army of Fordson tractors than in the summer.

Why did Ford need lumber? Ford needed very large amounts of lumber for many reasons. The production of early automobiles, such as the Model T, required up to 250 board-feet of lumber per vehicle. The wood was used in various parts of the car body, car frame, roof, exterior body paneling, wooden spoked wheels, and floor boards. Ford also needed wood for shipping crates, palllets, building materials for new manufacturing plants, railroad ties, boxcars for its rail lines, wooden patterns and mold making, fuel for heating the factories and worker's homes, and steam production to power his factorie's massive production equipment



To counter anticipated price-gouging by suppliers, Ford bought huge tracts of forested land to ensure a continuing low cost supply of lumber for his needs. One such purchase involved buying 313,000 acres of forested land in the UP in 1920. Ford eventually owned over 700,000 acres of timberland in the UP, four iron mines, six sawmills, the world's largest glass factory, and several copper mines just to meet daily demands of all his factories.

The Alberta sawmill is now restored to its former glory along with the adjacent town-site that included dozens of homes for the Ford workers. It has been donated to Michigan Tech University to be used as a living heritage museum of a by-gone industrial era. It was brought back to life for a one-day production run in 1997 to demonstrate how all of the production equipment operated. When shut down in 1954, all of the various wood logs, slabs, boards, and finished cut dimensional lumber parts were stopped in the final resting places for exhibit in the Ford - Alberta sawmill to show future generations the manufacturing techniques used to build the wood parts of vehicles in the 1920's to mid-1950's.
