June 11 Food Drive:

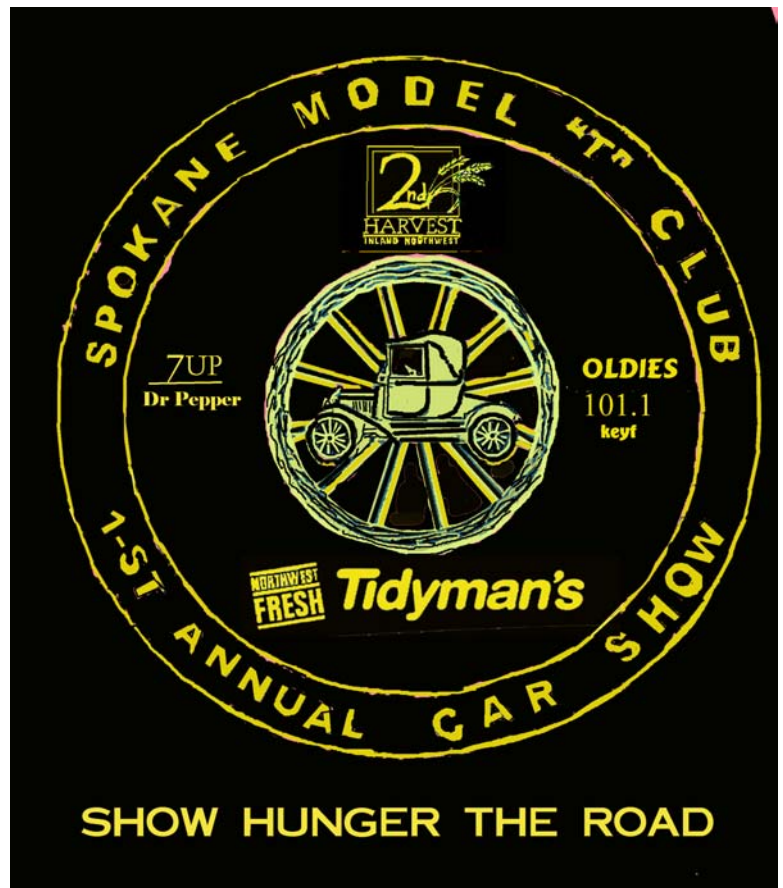
