There are no weight restrictions (at least for this year!) so get your cars oiled up and prepared for these races.

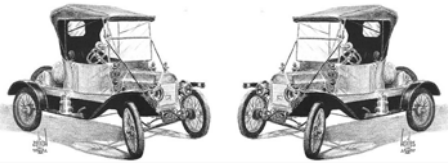
Wes Miller says it is time again for **Road Clean Up**. He will be meeting again at the same time and place. They have been having a lot of fun so make sure you show up.

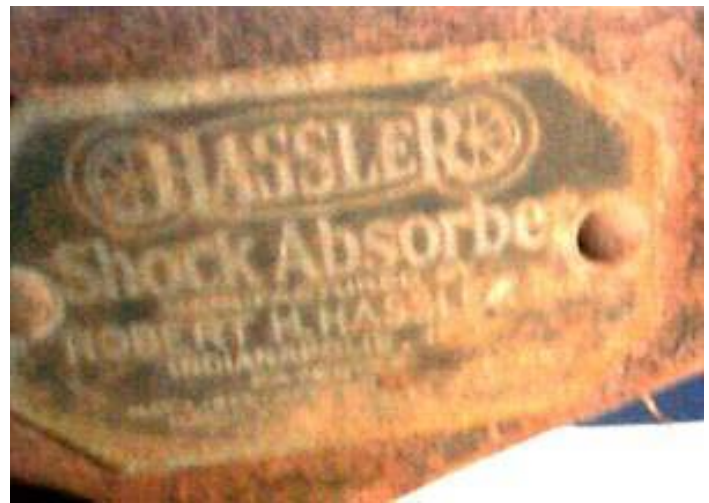
