Seen, Heard and Shared



I joined the Spokane Model T Club after purchasing a 1919 Model T Touring out of Montana. At that first club meeting I was told that the problem with having a Model T in my garage was that they tended to multiply. Not understanding that I left my Touring sitting in the garage for several years. Now today there is still the 1919 Touring, a 1918 Speedster, a 1926 Roadster Pick-up, a 1926 Roadster and a 1925 Fordson Tractor. The Fordson is difficult to explain so I won't even try. I do want you to know that the words at that first club meeting turned out to be very true.

Since it is close to 2018 I thought it would be interesting to say something about our 1918 Model T Speedster. Rose and I purchased the Speedster in April 2014 and like most stories the Speedster changed owners several times without a title change. We had a 1979 Oregon title in the names of Arthur & Doralee Erickson. In February 2016 we learned that someone was looking for the current owner of our Speedster, so after several days and Rose making many phone calls we learned that that someone was Bob Rankin from the Northwest Vintage Speedster Club, Portland OR. Bob Rankin told us a lot about our Speedster, including that it finished 4th in the annual endurance race held in Spokane in 1990. Bob Rankin provided us a picture of our Speedster at the 1994 12th Annual Labor Day Endurance Race held in McMinnville, OR. Gene Kicha from Spokane is seen in the picture along with Arthur Erickson. Bob also asked if the "racing engine" was still in the car, something we knew nothing about. The following is the short story that we finally pieced together after our conversations with Bob Rankin and others.

We were told that Arthur Erickson died in September of 2000 and his widow moved with her son to somewhere in Washington State. We were also told that since that move Doralee had passed away. Not being able to locate Arthur's son we went to the person we purchased the Speedster from and worked the movement of the Speedster backwards. We purchased the Speedster from Ron Sanders whose father Merrill Sanders (now deceased) had purchased it from the Roads family in Sandpoint, ID, who traded a Honda motorcycle to an Erickson who lived in Addy, WA. Rose tried many ways to locate an Erickson in Addy without success. On a beautiful Saturday morning Rose suggested that we drive to Addy and see if we could located Arthur Erickson's son. My response was that it was a good day for a drive but that we would never be able to find an Erickson in Addy.

To make a long story short we did drive to Addy looking for an Erickson. When we pulled off of the highway there was a man in an SUV parked in the middle of the road and he was talking to a man on a motorcycle. After the man on the motorcycle rode away we pulled up to the man in the SUV and asked him if he knew an Erickson who used to own a Speedster and showed him a picture of our Speedster. This man responded yes, he knew the Erickson we were looking for but the Erickson we were looking for never lived in Addy and never owned our Speedster. It turned out that we were talking to George Welch, Doralee's biological son, Arthur Erickson's step-son. George invited us to his home where we met Doralee (not deceased) and had the pleasure of listening to her stories of the many adventures she and Arthur had in their Speedster. One story included Doralee being thrown out of the Speedster when Arthur made a fast and sudden turn. That Saturday drive was filled with many surprises one being that we made the drive looking for the wrong person and the first person we talked to was the right person. How does that happen? But the other great surprise was yes Doralee still had the racing engine that Arthur once had in our Speedster. Rose and I were able to purchase back the 1918 engine with a RAJO head on it. That engine and head are currently being rebuilt and we hope to have our Speedster up and running sometime this summer. There would be no better way to celebrate 2018 than to be driving down the road in our 1918 Speedster.

More excitement is that our name was drawn to have a picture of a pre-war car on the cover of the 2018 INCCC (Inland Northwest Car Club Council) Calendar of Events. Hopefully, it will be a picture of our Speedster. Thanks for reading our story and hopefully many more stories to come. — Charley & Rose Hodges

Seen, Heard and Shared



Last month, we showed Step 1 of making a cut-away view of a Model T engine. This step included the first actual cast iron cutting on the engine's head with 3 major cuts using an 8 tpi (teeth per inch) cast iron Saws-All reciprocating saw blade available at your local Home Depot. A sub-part of Step 1 included sawing the intake and exhaust manifolds in half length-ways. Of particular interest is the fact that the first cut was a cut from the head's front end to the # 3 spark plug hole end of the head to the opposite end which took about 30 minutes. Surprisingly, after the 30 minute cut, the specialty saw blade was only luke warm to touch and didn't appear to show any wear. The 2nd cut was made from the 3rd spark plug diagonally to the rear of the head, and the 3rd cut was made from the right side of the head directly to the 3rd plug hole. The final cutting step was to cut the intake and exhaust manifolds in-half.

Step 2 includes cleaning the engine block, engine pan, and transmission cover by power washing and sand blasting. The lower left engine side panels are cut out to expose the rod bearings, timing gear & cam shaft, internal oil tube, and valve lifters. All engine components are removed, hand cleaned, sand blasted, and re-installed. Insuring everything is re-installed very loosely to allow for easy engine turn-over is required.

The attached photos show the cut-aways at the end of this phase of our fun project. More info and photos next month in Step 3. — Jim Patterson
