## Cut-Away Model T Engine update

After about 6 months of interrupted work sessions, I'm finally nearing the completion of my winter project of building up (or destroying, depending on your point of view) my working cut-away 1919 Model T engine. The cast iron block cutting is complete and the engine has been very loosely re-assembled so that all the internal components consisting of the crank shaft, valves and lifters, rods, pistons, cam shaft, carburetor, magneto, transmission, clutch, and associated components are all in place and are in moving and viewable working order. I have found that you don't over tighten bearings or any moving parts as it makes the engine too hard to turn over by hand cranking. I considered installing a starter motor to turn the engine over, but decided against it for simplicity.

#### My intentions for doing this project were:

**1.** Providing a simple visual representation of how the Model T power-train works for anyone interested in the mechanics of the Model T.

**2.** I have 10 grand-kids (6 grand-sons and 4 granddaughters) and I'm hoping to instill in one or more *(continued next page)* 



of them the life-long love for the Model T that I have experienced. So far, I may I have 2 of the 10 hooked.

3. Several years ago, I purchased all the Model T parts that a Model T friend was liquidating. I ended up with 4 spare engine blocks, one of which was a poor condition 1919 block that had severely pitted cylinder walls. I chose that block to be my cut away engine.

**4.** To provide memory reinforcement on the Model T engine components for my aging brain! I'm having a lot of

fun trying to get an engine that is cut up in a dozen or so pieces to work like a working engine.

**5.** To promote discussions of the Model T's mechanical designs. Several club members have supplied assembly help, free parts, and technical expertise on this project, including, Tom Carnegie, Bill Barr, Mark Hutchinson, Gene Kicha, Frank Baker, and Mike Robison. Many thanks go out to all of them for their help and support.

Since I have previously briefed the T Club on the continuing progress of the project, I'll not go into that again. The final steps to be completed are to electrify the ignition system by having tiny L.E.D. lights simulating the sequential firing of the spark plugs at each cylinder, installation of a coil box to show the Model T ignition system, and finally, finishing an engine moveable stand to display it.
