Above: AIR-FRICTION CARBURETOR. An aftermarket carburetor c.1918 that claimed to give the Model T 34 MPG with easy winter starts and power up hills. Made of aluminum and brass with two eisenglass port holes to view the fuel level. Made in Dayton, Ohio. An original advertisement is shown at top right.

Right: MOTION LAMP with 1912 Model T Touring image on one side, and a Stutz Bearcat on the other. These were popular novelty lamps in the 1950s. When turned on, the heat of the light bulb turned an inner cylinder that made the wheels and background appear to move and drive down the road. Many of these melted due to the owner putting in too hot of a bulb. This one belonged to my Great Grandfather.
