

Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the April 2, 2021 Club Meeting

President Steve Heid called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. and welcomed everyone.

➔ **Welcome:** Steve said he saw some new faces in the crowd and Montana Barnard introduced new member Rodney Waltz, who has had a '15 Roadster in Montana's shop all winter. (Montana warned him that he hasn't seen the bill yet.) Also joining us were Ron and Barbara MacKenzie, who are attending their first meeting. They said they don't have a Model T, but lots of pieces to a '26 Speedster. We also welcomed someone we haven't seen at a meeting for awhile—Jeff Hipp, the *Fender Chatter* editor, along with Tammy and Parker.

➔ **Newsletter:** As Jim and Betty Patterson step back from *Fender Chatter* duties, Carla Carnegie, and Rich & Wanda Hummer have volunteered to help Jeff. Everyone is encouraged to please share stories or photos for the newsletter! We need everyone's help.

The minutes from the March meeting were approved as printed in the *Fender Chatter*.

➔ **Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Karma Roth stated that she has filed the annual report for the club, and her report was approved as presented.

➔ **Sunshine:** Steve did not hear from Susie Carnegie, but she did send a card to Julie Heid, who is finally feeling a little better. Steve also announced that he recently suffered a minor stroke, but is doing O.K. He recommends that everyone know the signs of a stroke and that getting to the hospital immediately makes all the difference.

➔ **Library:** Myron Richardson has become Brooks Johnson's hero—he's checking things out of the club library, and bringing them back.

➔ **Safety & Seminars:** Larry & Norma Skidmore have offered to host a Safe T Inspection this year. Steve is going to propose a date of Sunday, June 6th, beginning at 9 a.m. [That date was later confirmed by Norma] Matt Hansen will donate hamburger, and Nan Robison will donate Ian to flip 'em. Mike Robison arrived too late to hear this announcement, but in time to find out that he is organizing this.

➔ **Tours:** Matt and Ralph Brevik had two ideas for tours, one short and one long. We decided to start with a short shake-down tour of about 40 miles from Spokane Valley to Rathdrum for ice cream. The longer tour will be about 80 miles to Long Lake, Loon Lake (for ice cream!), and Deer Park. Dates to be announced depending on the weather.

Matt reported that the Montana 500 will be held in Kalispell, Montana beginning on Father's Day weekend, but that he hasn't heard anything more about it yet.

➔ **National Tour Update:** Matt also gave an update about the MTFCA National Tour in July. We have 112 cars and 222 people registered. We have a lot of good donations coming in for the tour bag and gift baskets. We need volunteers to help, especially on Thursday, July 8th and Friday, July 9th to prepare the tour bags, greet people and get trailers parked, and on the last tour day, Wednesday, July 14th. The Wednesday tour is to places of interest in downtown Spokane along the City Drive. We will be based at the Clock Tower Meadow at Riverfront

Park, and will need help directing people to parking and placing cloths under the cars to catch drips. We would also like to have a local person with their T stationed at each site—for example, Kendall Yards or Manito Park—to describe to people what they can see and do at each location. A tour day you might want to register for is Saturday, July 10th when we will be going to Coeur d'Alene and joining the Pharoahs Car Show. Registering for the tour gets your car entered into the show, and there will be some great prizes. We will have shuttles from the Fairgrounds to downtown so that people can shop or explore.

The next Nat'l Tour meeting will be held in Ralph Brevik's new shop on Monday, April 5th at 6:30 p.m. BYOC: bring your own chair. [After the meeting, this was changed to Monday, April 12th so that we could watch the Gonzaga Bulldogs play in the March Madness Championship Game.]

Bill Barr has been busy collecting donations for the National Tour, but he is still in the name tag business. If you are a new member or an old member in need of a new name tag, contact Bill.

➔ **Swap Meet:** The V8 Club is looking for help on Thursday, July 9th at 8 a.m. to set-up for the swap meet. The Model T Club will not have a booth this year because the dates conflict with the National Tour.

➔ **Old Business:** None.

➔ **New Business:** The INCCC calendar of events is now available.

The All Wheels Show and Swap—a car show and swap meet—will take place at Mirabeau Park Hotel on Sunday, April 18th beginning at 9 a.m.

Rick Carnegie reported on the Chickasha Swap Meet, beginning by saying that Matt spent more money than he did (don't tell Maggie). In spite of a canceled flight, a late arrival causing their rental car to not be available, and then not being able to get a rental car because of spring break demand, a good time was had by all. They managed to get rides from the airport, to the swap meet, and back to the airport, and to get all of their new treasures home. Matt highly recommends going to this show at least once. There is a lot of stuff and cars that you don't see anyplace else, and a lot of T stuff.

Parker Hipp is busy with disc golf (and Tammy too) now that hockey season is over, but hasn't been able to get his dad out to play.

Jeff Hipp has been busy working on an Early Ford Auto Evolution poster with pictures and text of the first Fords, going through all the letters, numbers, and ending in 1939 (he brought a printed draft to share with everyone). Jeff has been consulting Rick Carnegie for accuracy.

➔ **50/50 Drawing:** The 50/50 drawing benefitting the INCCC Scholarship Fund was won by Jim Patterson.

The May club meeting might be at the Hauser Lake Fire Dept. again or outside if the weather is nice—watch your email.

The meeting adjourned at 7:42.



Model T Aftermarket Items and Accessories

I think it's fun to collect Model T related items - a legitimate part of the hobby. Below are just a few of the interesting items that I have picked up over the years. I hope you find them interesting too. — Jeff Hipp

Top: OH! YOU JITNEY PENNANT. This comical pennant is from the 1920s - measures 34"x13.5", made of felt and stencilled design. The "5" refers to the cost of a Jitney fare. "*Oh! You Jitney*" was a funny slang saying, very popular among young folks of the time (like saying "Oh! You Scoundrel", etc.). As I noted in the March 2021 issue... The Model T was easy to poke fun of in early 20th century American culture. It had many nicknames - all making light of the car being *cheap, smaller and maybe embarrassing to be seen in*. The name "*Jitney*" was most-popular between 1900 and 1950. Used early-on as a name for a five-cent piece, then as a term for a bus or other vehicle carrying passengers for a low fare.

Lower Left: TUNGSTEN SPARK PLUG TIN. Tungsten spark plugs were one of many brands available in the early days of automobiles and farm engines. This one is the 1/2 Inch size for the Ford Model T. I don't have the plug itself yet, but am looking for one.

Lower Right: FORD PRINT BLOCK. This is a recent addition to my collection. Ford script with "The Universal Car" slogan, the style that was used in the 1920s. This advertising printing block is about 1 inch wide, made of copper and mounted to a wood block. It was used on large printing presses for ads, letterhead, etc as needed by local Ford dealers. *I shared the earlier winged pyramid version in Aug 2020.*




