- ◆ Treasurer's Report: Karma Roth's treasurer's report was approved as presented.
- Sunshine: Susie Carnegie sent out a sympathy card to Dick Hathaway and a get well card to Judi Barnard.
- **♦ Safety & Seminars:** There was no report as Mike Robison was not present.
- ◆ Tours: Nothing scheduled yet, but we have some ideas for tours. Carla Carnegie would like to have a Tea Party for the ladies in the summer when we can dress up. Brooks Johnson said the Historic Flight Museum at Felts Field could display up to 18 cars, we just need to pick a date.

Myron has been reviewing old Vintage Ford magazines for ideas and thought we might have a hill climb.

Matt Hansen suggested that we create a tour committee to come up with ideas. It was never intended to be tour chairperson's job to organize tours—that would be an enormous task for one person—only to encourage other people to plan one and report to the club. Remembering Dixie I. Crabb 1942-2021



We just learned of, and regret to announce that long-time Spokane T Club member, Dixie Crabb, passed away on November 16, 2021. Dixie and her husband, Mike Crabb, were among the early members of the Spokane Model T Club - joining around 1974. Their Model T was a driver easily logging 500 to 700 miles each year. After Mike's death in 2015, Dixie still remained active with the club. She would move to the Orchard Crest Retirement Village in Spokane Valley, and in 2019 hosted a stop on a club tour (photo below). Our thoughts go out to her family.



The F.A. Williams Pioneer Ford Dealership sign

Located in downtown Spokane near W. Steam Plant Alley (Railroad Ave) & S. Post Street. One of many majestic antique ghost signs that still appear on Spokane buildings, even 110+ years past when first painted. You can see it while driving on I-90.

F.A. Williams Pioneer Ford was one of the earliest automobile dealerships in Spokane and was located at 807 First Avenue. The sign is near Sprague Ave (which used to be US Hwy 10) a heavily traveled arterial thru Spokane - and one of the first major routes thru the northwestern states from 1926-1969.






