SPOKANE INTERSTATE FAIR MODEL T SHOW

For those T club members who are participating in this year's Spokane Interstate Fair exhibit on Sept. 16th, here is the pertinent information (as much as we know) that you need to know:

Participants need to let Nan Robison know names and year of car **BEFORE August 1st!** (waiting to hear from the fair on 2023 deadlines)

2023 FAIR AND EXHIBIT THEME:

The fair's theme this year is "It's Showtime!" that can be followed if you wish to freely participate in the competitive exhibit display.

This year our club is going to try to have different categories for anyone who wishes to participate. These will be judged by a team from the club. The categories will be as follows:

1) "Oooo Shiny!!" This is a beauty contest.

2) "Most Honest". This will be for the car that is not necessarily gorgeous, but is used and is part of the owners daily life.

3) "Best Display". This will be a display of the owners choice that compliments your car, or a display of tools, a description and interactive display or whatever you decide.

4) Nan will try to set up a people's choice ballot box again.

If everything goes according to plan, there will be prizes in each category.

If you want to add period clothing or other props to your individual display or have items that would go well in the overall club exhibit, please bring them along. If you just wish to have a display, but not be judged, that is ok too.

Model T Show, Tell and Share Model T Aftermarket Items and Accessories



SOO CLINCHER TIRE TOOL. I picked this up recently at the Spokane swap meet. Made by the Soo Tool Company of Sioux City, IA.

I've read that this handy Soo clincher tire tool is not necessarily a bead breaker or tire spreader, but is intended as a changing aid to hold the tire bead so it does not slip off when you are working on the opposite side of the tire. One side has a larger prong to maybe hold the rim better, and when you clamp it down, it locks onto the tire. Made in a compact design so it will fit in the car's tool compartment or toolbox.

I have a spare tire that I need to swap out the tube, so will find out soon if this actually helps, or hinders, the whole process of changing the tire.

I have not been able to find any literature or ads on this item. If anyone has any info, please share.



July 1-2 LeClerc Creek T Olympics & Campout Tour





Hansen Family Legacy

This Model T was in the showroom of Hansen Ford in Idaho Falls. Farrel Hansen, Sr., was a businessman and farmer who made a significant impact on agriculture in Idaho. After Hansen's untimely death in 1949, his wife Lily assumed possession of the dealership. Though Ford Motor Company was progressive enough to allow women to work in their factories, they were not as forward-thinking with their dealerships or salaried positions. Once they discovered Lily's ownership, they revoked her dealer license. Interestingly, Lily never learned to drive. This car was soon left to the elements on the family farm in Osgood. Many years later, it was fully restored by her son, former state senator John D. Hansen.
