Minutes for the Friday, October 6, 2023 Meeting

The minutes from the September meeting were approved as printed in the Fender Chatter.

- ◆ Treasurer's Report: Karma Roth distributed the financial statement for August and September. It was noted that each financial statement is prepared based on items that have cleared the bank per the most recent bank statement. The treasuer's report was approved as presented.
- Vice President: Jim Elenbaas had nothing to report.
- Sunshine: Susie Carnegie was not at the meeting, but we are happy to hear that Rose Hodges is doing well.
- Safety & Seminars: Mike Robison was not at the meeting and there was no report.
- ◆ Tours: Nan Robison reports that there was a great turnout for the Model T Club display at the Spokane Interstate Fair. Thank you to everyone who stayed until 6 p.m. − 20 out of 22 cars were able to stay. It's wonderful to have so many Model T's come out for this event! There was very little participation from some of the other clubs. Thank you also to Jim and Betty Patterson for coming to judge. Montana Barnard and Nan stepped in for the other judges who were not able to make it. Our winners this year were: Oooo Shiny! won by Jim and Sandi Elenbaas in their 1914 Runabout; Best Display won by Bill and Diana Barr in their 1927 Touring Car and a great set-up with a lot of interesting information; Most Honest won by Karma Roth in "Broadway", Nan's 1926 Touring Car; and People's Choice won by Tom & Sandy Olson and their 1916 Touring Car. If you won this year, you will be one of our judges next year.

Nan also reported that there was not time to put a No Frills Speedster Run together this year. There is currently nothing on the schedule for the rest of October or November, but we do have a few events coming up in December. Breakfast with Santa is on December 10 at the Hayden Fire Department. On December 16, University High School is having a Parade of Lights. The parade is only 8 blocks if anyone is interested in stringing lights on their T and coming out. We are also planning to have a Christmas Soup Party this year – more details about this next month.

Nan presented \$25 gift cards to the winners at the Fair and a motion was passed to reimburse her. Nan was also a big winner at the Fair herself: 66 blue ribbons, 25 red ribbons, 2 white ribbons, 1 participation ribbon for a cucumber that didn't quite make the two pound weight minimum, and 5 special awards. Congratulations, Nan!

■ Badges: Bill Barr has been making identification badges for members and will be ordering more supplies.

- ♠ Banquet: Matt Hansen has the church and caterer in place for the Annual Banquet. We will also be having a silent auction, which was a very popular event last year. My wife and I have been anticipating taking a Viking River cruise since 2020 when we had originally booked a trip from Basel, Switzerland to Amsterdam. As you know, COVID changed everyone's plans that year. Finally this year it became a reality. The trip included "long time friends" who now live in Michigan. Our plans were to spend an additional week in the Netherlands to visit the ancestral sites of all our families. During the past 3 years while browsing Facebook's "Model T Ford Club of Facebook" site I had noted several postings by Gerald Verweij who owned a 1925 Model T Roadster Pickup. Since I also have the same Pickup I had thought that it would be fun to connect with him to possibly see his T pickup.

In mid-July of this year I sent him a message introducing myself and asked if there were going to be any T related events taking place during the time we would be there and if not could I visit him and his T. He quickly responded that the Model A Club, along with the T and early V8 club, were hosting a tour in Barneveld which would give opportunity to see many of the Dutch owned cars. Over the course of the next couple weeks arrangements were made for the four of us to ride with his father and mother (Peter and Jacqueline) in their 1923 Touring (photo above) and our friends to ride with Ron and Yvonne Letter in their 1931 Model A Fordor sedan.

On the morning of the 19th of August we arrived at the starting point of the tour in Barneveld. I knew immediately that this

was going to be a big event because at the entrance of the driveway was a large boom truck with a banner advertising the tour. The large grass field already had about 30 cars parked by 8 a.m. and over the course of the next hour, 30 plus more cars arrived. Gerald was directing traffic at the gate and we were greeted very warmly by him. As the cars arrived it was evident that the Dutch take great pride in their vintage cars as all were restored immaculately. I was also impressed with the variety of the rare early Ford cars, especially two 1931 Model A "A400" sedan convertibles and a 1926 Lincoln Dual Cowl Phaeton.

Around 9:30 a.m., coffee and delicious dutch pastries were served, followed by an opening ceremony of which we were provided a copy in English so we could follow along.

The tour was of the rally format, where all directions were given by road names and distance traveled. The area around Barneveld is a very prosperous area of Holland. It is known for its egg production of which they supply most of the Netherlands with eggs. As in many parts of rural Holland the roads are very narrow and they are farmed to the edge of the roadway. With many people riding bikes and beautifully maintained farms, it was a real delight to see. After about two hours of touring we arrived at our lunch location, the Castle De Schaffelaar. The venue was hosting the International Hot Air Balloon Festival and had provisions to serve a catered lunch with many options for your culinary taste. In keeping with Barnevelds agricultural specialty, fresh fried eggs were one of the items on the menu. One item new to me was Mustard soup. It was delicious.

Our return to the starting point took us through more of the Dutch countryside with windmills, dairies and thatched roofed houses. On our return, hot snacks and beer and wine were provided. At that time a raffle was conducted with the grand prize being tickets for a ride in one of the hot air balloons. We were sad to have to leave at the end of the day because we had such a great time.

I have been on several MTFCA national tours and none were better than this Dutch Treat in Barneveld. —*Jim Elenbaas*




