# **Meeting Minutes**

#### Minutes for the Friday, November 3, 2023 Meeting

President Ralph Brevik called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m. and thanked everyone for coming. There were no new members or guests.

The minutes from the October meeting were approved as printed in the Fender Chatter.

◆ Treasurer's Report: Karma Roth distributed the financial statement. She reminded everyone that dues for 2024 are now payable. A motion was passed to authorize Karma to transfer money from the savings account to the checking account as needed to pay bills. A motion was passed to reimburse Janice Hutchinson for the renewal of the website domain name registration and to reimburse Nan Robison for supplies. The treasurer's report was approved as presented.

There was discussion about charging \$20 per year for members to receive a printed copy of the *Fender Chatter* each month. Also discussed was possibly raising the dues to cover increasing expenses for postage, meeting space rental, and post office box rental. The amount of dues is specified in Article VII, Section 4 of the By-Laws. If we want to change the dues we will need to follow the procedures to change the By-Laws. Tom Carnegie requested that a report be prepared showing the per capita expenses for club members. Karma will prepare this report and the subject was tabled until this can be done.

- Vice President: Jim Elenbaas had nothing to report.
- ◆ Sunshine: Susie Carnegie reports that the only cards sent were those listed in the Fender Chatter.
- ◆ Tours: Nan Robison reports that there were no tours since the last meeting and there are none scheduled in November. There are a few events coming up in December. Breakfast with Santa is on December 10 at the Hauser Lake Fire Station from 7 a.m. 1 p.m. Driving your Model T to this event will get you a parking spot right in front of the station. On December 16, University High School is having a Parade of Lights more information about this at the December meeting. The 26th Christmas Soup Party is scheduled for Sunday, December 17th at Mark and Janice Hutchinson's house beginning at 3 p.m. We are also working on a possible New Year's Day tour.
- ➡ Library: Brooks was not at the meeting and there was no report.
- ➡ Badges: Bill Barr was not at the meeting and there was no report.
- ◆ Annual Banquet: The banquet will be on Friday, January 5th at Opportunity Presbyterian Church. The cost is \$25 per person. Checks should be made out to IEMTFCA and given to Karma at the December meeting or mailed to club. We are looking for donations for the silent auction. Please bring these to the December meeting if you can. If you prefer to bring them to the banquet directly, please contact Matt Hansen or Ralph Brevik to let them know what you are bringing.
- ◆ New Business: Elections were held for next years officers and the results are:

President: Larry Mann Vice President: John DeJong, Secretary: Janice Hutchinson Treasurer: Karma Roth

Mark Hutchinson thanked Susie Carnegie for being a "treasure" in our club. Her cards are a real pick-up when someone needs one.

There was discussion about the need to have 50% of our paid membership also be members of the Model T Ford Club of America in order to qualify for their liability insurance. This insurance does not provide automobile insurance for individual members, but protects the club if it is sued related to an incident that occurs during a club-sanctioned event. It was questioned what benefit members of the MTFCA receive, which would be the Vintage Ford subscription and being able to advertise cars for sale in this national magazine. We are also a chapter of the Model T Ford Club International, which provides the same type of liability insurance to its member chapters without the 50% membership requirement. Club officers would still need to be members of the MTFCA for us to remain as a member chapter. We will have more information about this at the next meeting.

- Wednesday Night Dinners: We are still going to dinner on Wednesdays except on the third Wednesday of the month and on the week of our monthly meetings because we go to dinner on Friday that week. If you have a place you would like to go, contact Ralph.
- ◆ Tuesday Night at Antique Auto Ranch: Tom was asked if he is still opening for us for Tuesday nights and said of course we are.
- ▶ There was no **Tech Talk** this month, but there was a **Show & Tell:** Montana Barnard brought in a pair of 1913 license plates made of leather. He is giving them to Mike Stormo, who has a 1913 to put them on. Jim Elenbaas is looking for a pair of cars originally from Clarkston, Washington, that were issued 1913 leather license plates with consecutive numbers in March of that year. If you know of anyone with a 1913 that used to be or still is in Clarkston, please let Jim know.

Myron Richardson added that before 1912 there were no "plates" issued by the state – the license number was painted directly onto the car fender or painted onto homemade "plate" of whatever material the painter had available. In 1912 the first state-issued license plates were produced in Washington – like Montana's 1913 leather plates. The first steel plates were produced in 1915 with a 1916 expiration date.

Scott Colgrove won the 50/50 drawing and many people took home door prizes – either a lottery ticket or a dozen eggs donated by Nan Robison's chickens.

Ralph adjourned the meeting at 7:50 p.m. Thank you all for coming!

# Light 'er Up!


Back in the 1990s, and before, our club would have Christmas lights tours. We would attach a string of x-mas lights around our Model Ts and go on a tour (yes, in the snow at night) to see neighborhoods with pretty holiday light displays. Kind-of a mini parade of our own. The lights on our cars were mostly powered by the car's battery, or an extra battery on-board. Below is a diagram from a 90s *Fender Chatter* on how to convert a string of lights to DC power. It was usually long enough to go around the top (roadster?) and around the back window. *–Jeff*


### CHRISTMAS "T" LIGHTS =

EQUIPMENT NEEDED: A 30 light set of the 110 volt miniature (3/4") bulbs on a loop cord, about 30 ft. of two color bell wire or plastic coated lamp cord, two alligator clips, electric tape, and wire strippers help.

PROCEDURE: Splice light wires in parallel on the main line. Staggering the attachment points helps eliminate any possible short. The number of lights possible is dictated by the capacity of the main line used. 12 volts merely gives a brighter light than 6 volts. Flasher lights will also work.



X- YOU MAY NEED 2 OR 3 BULBS ON EACH CROSS SECTION DEPENDING ON LIGHT BULB VOLTAGE.

# Model T Aftermarket Items and Accessories







STAR TOOL COMPANY MODEL T TRANSMISISON BANDS TOOL. Made in Indianapolis, this is an all-in-one tool to compress the three transmisison band ears (pre 1926) to aid in adjusting the pedal nuts, washers, springs, etc. It gives you an extra hand to help keep from dropping small parts deep into the transmission.

The handles press down and lock as the jaws compress. I've tried it, and it works surprisingly well. It Measures 9 1/4" long and the Jaws are about 4" wide - made of cast iron.

You find these around swap meets nowand-then. You can find them online for a lot more \$\$\$.

I think it's fun to collect Model T related items - a legitimate part of the hobby. Above is just one of the interesting items that I have, and thought I'd share. I hope you find them interesting too. — Jeff Hipp


