While there are many better books about Model T's, it was the perfect book for a teenager, and I enjoyed reading about Model T history, humor, and ads, and looking at the many photos.

The ride with Rick and the book planted a seed that got me interested in the Model T, but it took years before I bought one of my own. About 20 years ago Mike Robison gave me a ride and a driving lesson in his Model T Roadster. An Article Short Series by John De Jong 8,259 Easy Steps for Building a Speedster

Part One I am relatively young to be into Model T's, I got my first T at age 39 and am now 43. As I write that down it looks older than I feel. My T journey started 21 years ago when I married my wife. Her father (Jim) had a 1916 Touring car he restored and this is the T that started it all. He retired the year I married his daughter and had more time on his hands and he has built many T's after that. I have always liked mechanical things and working with my hands so seeing him build and restore model T's sparked my interest.

When I moved out of an apartment and bought a house, the natural path lead to building a shop so I had a place to work on and store "stuff". Once the shop was built I bought the 1916 Model T touring car from my father-in- law because it was a natural fit for our family of 5. I installed some seatbelts in the back so the little humans would not fall out as we tour it around. Having a running and driving model T is great, but I had the itch to build a car of my own, and a model T speedster was my next goal. Not knowing anything about fabrication or welding resulted in a year or two of thinking through the most basic processes and ideas to come up with a "look" I would be happy with, which would also be achievable without complex tools.

Like all great projects, there must be a beginning and that starts with collecting parts. I was lucky enough to have my father-in-law attend an estate auction of a car collector which resulted in the purchase of an Elgin 6 radiator and shell. For those who are not familiar with the Elgin Motor Car Corporation, it was created by executives of the Elgin Watch Company in 1916 but operated for only 8 years. The cars they made were good conservative cars that were popular in the Midwest, but early success was undone by the recession in the early 1920's which resulted in the bankruptcy filing in 1924. There are still a few Elgin cars around, but I have yet to see one in person.

I had the Elgin V style radiator looked at by several local radiator shops and all indicated the radiator was a lost cause or at least a very expensive endeavor without any certainty on the results so the radiator was shelved. The shell was still in great condition, and it just so happened to fit the model T radiator very nicely so finding a replacement was easier than I had anticipated. With the radiator and shell in hand I could see the vision forming.

With the radiator figured out now I just needed a good roller. One day a Hemmings Ad popped up with a 1921 Model T chassis ready to be made into a speedster. The seller indicated the motor was "rebuilt" and ready to run and just so happen to be less than 20 miles away! After multiple calls and emails I was finally able to connect and close on the deal.
