Meeting Minutes

Minutes for the Friday, April 4, 2025 Meeting

President Larry Mann called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m., stating that there was a good turn-out at Darcy's before the meeting and good food. He also introduced a guest at this month's meeting – Dan Garcia president of the Thunderbird Club. They are thinking about joining us on some of our tours this year.

The minutes from the March meeting were approved as printed in the *Fender Chatter* newsletter.

- ◆ Treasurer's Report: Karma Roth reported that there was not a lot of activity last month. There was minor bank error that was corrected. A motion was approved to reimburse her for the envelopes and stamps that she purchased to mail out the club rosters that were not picked up. The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.
- ❖ V.P. Report: John DeJong has reserved the same three booths for the Swap Meet that we had last year. He has a couple of ideas about how to set up the booths. The first is to build on the celebration of Bing Crosby's departure from Spokane to Los Angeles, which happed 100 years ago this year. If we chose this as a theme, the local non-profit that is organizing the celebration in October may contribute items for the booth and help defray the cost. John's second idea was to display a 100-year-old 1925 car at the booth. We would have to decide between Jim Elenbaas's shiny or Nan Robison's not-so-shiny Roadster Pickup. It was decided to have John check into the Crosby idea with the celebration organizers. He is also planning to make space available at the booth for club members who have things they would like to sell, and will have details about how this will be done later.
- Sunshine: Susie Carnegie was not at the meeting no report.
- **◆ Tours:** Our first tour is to Coeur d'Alene for antique shopping and lunch on Saturday, April 12.
- Our next tour is to display cars at the MAC's Historic Home Tour on Mother's Day Weekend, May 10th and 11th. We are hoping to have cars at Millwood Presbyterian Church from 12 noon 3 p.m. each day. Participants will receive free tickets to tour the homes, all but one of which are located within three blocks of the parking lot.
- Jim Elenbaas said that the Valleyfest organizers are interested in having us in their parade in September, and will allow us to join as a group and give us good positioning.
- The Progressive Dinner scheduled for June 21 is being changed because that is the date of Neighbor Day at Felts Field this year. The Progressive Dinner will be rescheduled at a later time.
- Dan Garcia has invited us to join the Thunderbird Club at the Ford Car Show on July 4th at Brookdale Park Place. If you wish to enter the competition, the registration fee is \$15, but it will be free to come put cars on display and Dan offered to supply free lunch tickets for Model T Club participants. He is also planning a trip to the Spokane Indians baseball game and fireworks show that evening if you would like to attend the game, please contact Larry Mann or Dan Garcia so that he can begin reserving tickets for the group.
- A motion was approved for Nan to rent a porta potty for the Driving School on June 7.

- Jim Elenbaas talked about how the Safe-T Inspection will be done this year. He will have three bays available in his garage to do inspections, and then the cars can be lined up on the lawn for pictures afterward. It was discussed that we have been ordering inspection stickers with the year printed on them, but that with a minimum order of 50, we have many that we don't use. Steve Heid and Jeff Hipp will look into what our options are for inspection stickers.
- Library: Brooks Johnson was not at the meeting no report.
- ♠ Name Tags: Bill Barr will be preparing a name tag for Sierra DeJong. If you need a new nametag, contact Bill.
- **◆ Refreshments:** Wanda says we have refreshments waiting, and they look good!
- Photo Albums: Roy Moffit was not at the meeting no report.
- ◆ Tuesday Night at Antique Auto Ranch: Tom Carnegie was not at the meeting, but Nan reports there are a number of projects being worked on. Nan repaired a generator. Mike Stormo is working on the magneto for his Case speedster. Mike Robison is working on his dashboard. Tom says it's finally warm enough that Nan can bring in Tweety to install helicoils.
- **◆** Fender Chatter: Editor Jeff Hipp received a round of applause for the great job he does on our newsletter. Jeff says he always needs content send photos and ideas!
- **Club Facebook Page:** Updated regularly by Jeff, Nan, Mike, and Jillian with information about the club.
- Old Business: Paul Murray reported more details about the Northwest Vintage Speedster's fall speedster run in Post Falls. The headquarters will be at Templin's Resort. Friday, September 12 is Registration and an afternoon back roads tour to Chuck Little's Museum, about 40 miles, that is open to all cars. On Saturday, September 13 there is a Lowland Tour around Lake Coeur d'Alene wiith lunch at the Golf Course in St. Maries, about 130 miles, that is also open to all cars. There is no fee to participate in Friday's or Saturday's tours. The Cops, Cars, and Cruisers Show in Liberty Lake is also taking place on Saturday, September 14, and the speedsters have been invited to drive around the track at Stateline Speedway at around 3 p.m., with entry into the races that night. Sunday, September 14 is the 200-mile speedster run to an undisclosed location.
- ▶ New Business: Nan reports that there was little news from the MTFCA meeting on March 17. They are working to upgrade their server to make internet access better. They are looking for clubs to host the 2027 National Tour. And we have been invited to the Santa Clara Speedster Run and Lowland Tour on June 8-9. If anyone is interested in this, please contact Nan for all the details.

We are sorry to hear that Bob Temple passed away suddenly. A motion was approved to purchase flowers for Judy.

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In Memoriam

Remembering Bob Temple • March 30, 2025



We regret to announce that long-time Spokane T Club member, Bob Temple, passed away on March 30, 2025. Bob and his wife, Judy, were fixtures of the Spokane Model T Club since joining in the mid 1980's.

Judy Temple writes the following:

Bob was 85 years young. For the past year or so he was battling Alzheimer's, had given up driving, but rode shotgun when (son) James drove him around in the 1915 "T" He loved that car. We always planned to get the '23 Touring back on the road, but it never quite happened, so it was the '15 depot hack that was his chariot.

When the twins were infants, 1982, I saw an ad for the '23 in the paper. I'd always wanted a Model T, turns out Bob always wanted a Touring, so off he went with our 5 year old to check it out. He came home to show me pictures, I asked him why he hadn't bought it, he headed straight back out and it came to live with us.

Soon afterwards we went to the Symphony concert in the park, and the T Club had a bunch of cars on display, so he stopped to talk to them. I think it was Steve Heid, we decided getting involved in the club was a good plan, so we joined. Not sure what year, maybe someplace it's in the records. Mid-1980s?

We did the national tour when it was in Spokane in 1989, and Bob got the "Trouble Trophy" for breaking down every day of the tour. I was driving the vulture wagon with our Suburban, just in case. Jim Patterson had outfitted the trouble trailers with CB radios. First call — "got a guy with 3 kids in the back who did in his engine (lack of oil, shattered bearings)", yep, he's mine. Next day he borrowed Jim's 23' touring to finish the tour, and...then the call, "got a guy with a flat tire and 3 kids in the back"..yep, he's mine. Got the tire changed and he finished the tour.

He loved doing the Lilac parade, and even stuck my 90 year old mother in the back seat one year. Despite mumbling remembering these things less fondly, she perfected "the wave" and quite enjoyed herself until it started raining.

I was the one who wanted the Depot Hack, so we found a chassis, ordered a body, paid Dusty some of our savings to fit it to the frame, varnish and paint (wonderful job), and thus the 1915 got on the road. And since it was brass, he could join the HCCA.

In addition to the HCCA, he also was a member of the MTFCA, enjoying their magazines as they arrived. We did the HCCA tour in Portland one year, including climbing MT Hood, slowly watching the radiator start to spit...then start to steam...and then at the top they wanted us to pull over

and wait to have our picture taken. No way, park this thing in a hurry and stand back! On the way down, flat tire, so we rode on the tow truck the rest of the way. Found out it takes 17 guys to change one non-demountable tire -3 to offer to help, and another 14 to stand around drinking beer and offering advice.

Bob got his undergrad degree from Harvard in physics, then went on to get his PhD in electrical engineering from the University of Colorado, where we met over 50 years ago. He worked for Hewlett Packard as an electrical engineer, both in design and project management in the field of phase noise measurements. He was a nationally recognized expert in his field, but the part he enjoyed most was working directly with customers who would call to "speak to the expert" on the instruments he designed, nationally and internationally. Some of his instruments are still in use today.

When the twins were less than a year old, he needed some software code modified for the new system, couldn't get anyone to do it, brought home an early 80s desktop computer with Rocky Mtn basic language, and promised to watch the kids if I could modify the software (I had been a computer programmer and IT manager before kids) over the weekend. Sure, no diapers for a weekend, and use my brain? Sign me up. Several years later ne needed schematics for some circuit boards, no one was available, he slipped me into work as a contractor under the guise of testing out a new schematic drawing system. Years later my software and drawings were still in use. He was resourceful, never one to quite go by the book.

He leaves behind me, absolutely brokenhearted, 5 children, 9 grandchildren, and 6 great-grandchildren. He is predeceased by a son.

And yes, we're the ones with the pipe organ. I play, Bob loved to listen.

April 15 note from Judy - Just a quick note to say thanks to the "T" Club for the flowers they sent in memory of Bob. Things are still rather hard for me, but I wanted the Club to know I appreciated the thought. And son James has made it clear that he wants to keep driving the Depot hack (he might actually have to learn how to tow the beast on the trailer....) No decision on a service yet. I can't face it yet.

MYSTERY IGNITION KEY: At the April 4 T Club meeting, Jim Elenbaas had this key for show and tell.

He had just bought a 1917 Touring which had this key. It appeared to have advertising for Riverside Motor Oil stamped on both sides. Nobody had ever seen one like this.

After a little internet sleuthing, it turns out that the Ford ignition key was made from an advertising bottle opener by Montgomery Ward stores. ("Monkey Wards" were the sellers of Riverside auto products).



Someone in the past had a little inginuity, and some spare time, to make this on order to save a few pennys from buying a new replacement key.


