## **Meeting Minutes**

#### Minutes for the Friday, June 6, 2025 Meeting

President Larry Mann called the meeting to order at 7:08 p.m., and welcomed two members we haven't seen for a while – Brooks and Pat Johnson.

The minutes from the May meeting were approved as printed in the *Fender Chatter*.

• **Treasurer's Report:** Karma Roth reported that there was not a lot of activity last month and that our accounts are in a healthy condition. There were no questions. The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.

♦ Vice President: John DeJong reminded us that move-in day at the Swap Meet is Friday, July 11, but he does not have a time yet. The Swap Meet will only be open for two days again this year – Saturday and Sunday. You may bring items to sell at the booth, with 10% of the proceeds going to the club. Please be sure to label all items with your name and the price. The Bing Crosby foundation has paid the fee for our booth spaces. There will be a member from the foundation there to talk about Bing Crosby, and there will be related items on display. John also reports that he participated in the Lilac Parade, which was really cold, really wet, and not something he thinks he would do again.

◆ Tours: Nan Robison's Driving School and Manifold Cooker Lunch will be on Saturday, June 7. A motion was approved to reimburse her for the food for this event. Future tours on the schedule are:

• Saturday, **June 21** to the Felts Field Neighbor Day open house. Parking for this event is hard to come by, and we are planning to park at Antique Auto Ranch and walk over to Felts Field. Larry suggested that we meet at Safeway on Trent & Argonne at 9:30. Watch your email for more details.

• Friday, **July 4** we have been invited to the Ford Car Show at Brookdale Park Place, 601 South Park Road. Model T's are not required to pay the entry fee unless you wish to have your car included in the judging. Dan Garcia also said he would buy our lunch! Please plan to be in place before 9 a.m. when the show opens. That evening, there is a Spokane Indians Game and fireworks afterward. You will need to purchase your own tickets if you wish to attend the game.

If you can volunteer to help with this event – registration, hospitality, tour bags, checkpoints, trouble trucks – please contact Paul Murray.

Banquet: John has taken on planning this and says, "We'll figure it out."

• Sunshine: Susie Carnegie sent a thank you to the Millwood Community Presbyterian Church for the use of their parking lot to give Model T rides.

C Library: Brooks Johnson reports that the library is up to date.

Name Tags: Bill Barr has made no new name tags.

• **Refreshments:** Larry Mann thanked Wanda Hummer for taking care of refreshments for us and she got a round of applause. (We have our priorities straight!)

Ralph Brevik reports that he has not been scheduling Wednesday Night Dinners, but if someone has a place they would like to go he will help get the word out. Ralph has also been calling Darcy's to make sure we have reservations on our meeting nights. Thank you, Ralph!

◆ Safety & Seminars: Mike Robison says 17 cars were inspected at the Safe-T Inspection, everything went smoothly, and then we had a great lunch! Thank you to Jim and Sandra Elenbaas for hosting – and we hope your lawn recovers! Mike says did not find anything glaringly bad on the cars he looked at. Bill Barr reports that he spent two hours fixing his steering – mostly getting onto and off of the creeper. Tom Carnegie's front end wins the award for most worn out – he says he doesn't oil it, grease it, wash it.... Mike says, "It shows." Mike appreciates everyone who stepped up to inspect and hopes it was a chance to learn more about Model T's.
