Meeting Minutes

Minutes for the Friday, November 7, 2025 Meeting

President Larry Mann called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m., actually using the president's gavel – gently, so as not to break the table. Larry said he decided to try out the gavel that has been weighing down his briefcase quite a bit. Steve Heid reports there were no new members or guests at this meeting.

The minutes from the October meeting were approved as printed in the Fender Chatter.

- ◆ Treasurer's Report: Karma Roth reports that we have a nice healthy bank balance and that we should discuss ways that we would like to use these funds. The was a motion made to reimburse Montana Barnard for the door prizes that he brings to each meeting, but Montana refused this offer. It was decided to have the club pay part of the cost of the annual banquet, and to purchase door prizes to be given at the banquet. John DeJong said he would purchase door prizes. The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.
- ❖ VP Report: John DeJong provided more information about the banquet, which will be held on Friday, February 6th at Opportunity Presbyterian Church, starting at 6 p.m. The cost will be \$20 per person, \$10 for kids 12 and under. Food will be catered from Outlaw BBQ with ice cream and lots of toppings for dessert. Please pay Karma by mid-January so that we will have a head count for ordering food. Also please contribute to our silent auction by giving items to John DeJong prior to the banquet, or bringing them that evening.
- ◆ Tours: Larry reports that we have no tours scheduled for November. It was reported that Breakfast with Santa at the Hauser Lake Fire Department would be on December 7, but a check online shows that it is actually being held on SUNDAY, DECEMBER 14 FROM 7 A.M. TO 1 P.M. The Hutchinsons' Annual Christmas Soup Party will be held on Sunday, December 21, beginning at 3 p.m. For those who haven't been to this event before, you do not need to bring anything all the food is provided.
- ♠ Roster & Membership: Karma asks everyone to please pay their dues as soon as you can, and to please fill out a Roster Update Form because she receivies many requests for changes after the Roster has been printed. Her goal is to have all dues collected by January 31st so that the Roster can be completed and available at the March meeting. Jim Elenbaas questioned whether the Roster could be sent out to club members digitally to save the cost of printing and mailing. One issue with this is that it would be a very large file perhaps too large to send by email and difficult to download. We have also traditionally been concerned about sending out members' names, addresses, contact information, and lists of the cars they own by email, which is not secure. Although secure email is available, the discussion ended with no motion being made.
- Sunshine: Susie Carnegie said she had no news to report.
- ▶ Refreshments: Wanda Hummer reminded everyone that we all bring cookies to share in December.
- ♦ Wed. Dinners: Ralph Brevik has not been planning Wednesday Night Dinners, but this is something we could still do. If you have an idea for a place to have dinner on a Wednesday Night, contact Ralph and he will set it up.
- ◆ Tues. Nights at Antique Auto Ranch: Tom Carnegie reports that John DeJong and Mike Stormo have been helping him set up the Dynamometer.
- **♦ Safety & Seminars:** Asked if he had anything to report, Mike Robinson replied, "No, thank you."
- ◆ Old Business: Nan Robison has researched getting a club banner with our contact information on it. Our current banner simply reads Spokane Model T Club. It is sometimes confusing to people, as we are also referred to as the Inland Empire Model T Club. Our banner also does not include any

information about how to find more information about the club or get in touch with us, and it does not have enough space to add this. One option is to completely replace our existing banner, which is 24 inches by 96 inches, and would cost \$499. There were two size options for add-on banners, which would hang below our current banner – either one 12 inch by 48 inch banner for \$148.60 or, two 12 inch by 36 inch banners for \$220.60. A third option was to just print posters with QR codes for our website and facebook page that could be set up at events. As our current banner is in good condition, a motion was passed to purchase a 12 inch by 48 inch banner with the QR codes, which could be attached to the bottom of our existing banner. Nan promptly delegated this task to Jeff Hipp.

- Enterainment: There was no entertainment planned for this evening.
- Tech Talk: Mike Robison gave a presentation on the Ruckstell shifter with props. He first showed everyone a standard Ruckstell shifter with the knob on top. We will call it Version 1.0 - a very cool thing, but always in the way. He then displayed Version 2.0, an emergency brake handle reconfigured into a Ruckstell shifter. But there is a problem – it mounts in the same spot as the emergency brake lever. John DeJong interjected that it can be done, and about 25 hours of work later you will have a shifter that is not always in the way. But Mike reminded us that we live in the modern age...Erik Hutchinson finally hired Mike to put a Ruckstell in his car. Wanting to use a Version 2.0 emergency brake handle shifter, Mike used a CAD program to create a drawing of a bracket that would make the shifter easy to install. The drawing looked great, but couldn't be used to mount the shifter. So he used a 3D printer to create the bracket in the drawing – in plastic. The plastic bracket looked great, but couldn't be used to mount the shifter. So he sent the drawing off to SendCutSend, and a week and \$6 later, voilà! He had a steel bracket. The steel bracket looked great, and it works great - no cuts, no burns, no holes drilled in the wrong place! If you would like to get your Ruckstell shifter out of the way, Mike has extra brackets available.

Jim Elenbaas mentioned that he had bent the bracket on his original, Version 1.0 shifter to create more space. There are also reproduction left-hand shifters available, but you will be forced to drill more holes in your frame to mount them.

- ◆ For Sale: Tom says that most everything at Antique Auto Ranch is for sale.
- ♠ New projects: John DeJong is working on a 3/4 scale Model T Speedster Go-Cart. Can't wait to see how that turns out!
- New Business: Roy Moffit is looking for a place to rent to store his dad's Model T. He would prefer to have the rental money go to a Model T guy rather than to a big corporation. Contact him if your are interested.
- **♦ Raffle:** The 50/50 drawing was won by Rod Waltz. Door prizes were won by Karma Roth, Colton Brevik, Susie Carnegie, Tom Olson, Larry Mann, Don Hart, Rich Hummer, and Mike Robison.
- ◆ Election of Officers for 2026: Larry asked if there were any additional nominations for President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer, but there were none. As all of these offices were unopposed, a motion was passed to elect officers by a voice vote. The 2026 officers will be:


As always when you drive an old car around, people tend to gather. There were lots of questions from the attendees but also the kids on the Gonzaga University campus about how to start it and how to drive it.
