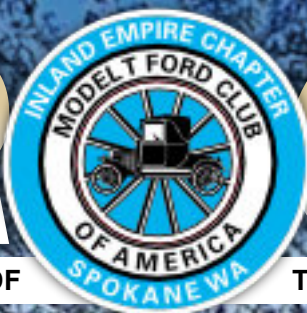

Meeting Minutes

Minutes for the Friday, December 5, 2025 Meeting

President Larry Mann called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m., saying it was good to see such a good turnout. He also said that Darcy's was so busy not everyone could find a seat. There were no new members or guests, but Jillian Robison raised her hand in case people don't remember her since we haven't seen her for a while.

➡ **Secretary's Report:** It was confirmed that there will be no meeting in January, and that the Annual Banquet is on Friday, February 6. The minutes from the November meeting were approved as printed in the *Fender Chatter*.

➡ **Treasurer's Report:** Karma Roth noted that she will check with the credit union about removing the service charge on our scholarship account. We have had this issue before, and it has not been a problem to have the charge reversed. The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented. She also reminded everyone that if you want to be included in the club roster, you must have your dues paid by January 15. She would like to get the rosters out sooner this year so that everyone has the current information. We do not have another meeting before then, so if you haven't paid, you may need to mail your dues.

➡ **V.P. Report:** John DeJong reviewed the plans for the banquet, which will be held on Friday, February 6th at Opportunity Presbyterian Church, starting at 6 p.m. The cost will be \$20 per person, \$10 for kids 12 and under. Food will be catered from Outlaw BBQ and will include brisket, chicken, and sides. We will have ice cream and lots of toppings for dessert. John is working on door prizes. Please pay Karma by January 15 so that we will have a head count for ordering food. Also, please contribute to our silent auction by giving items to John DeJong prior to the banquet, or bringing them that evening.

➡ **Tours:** There has been a change to the date of Mark & Janice Hutchinson's Soup Party, which will now be held on Sunday, January 4, beginning at 3 p.m. Our only event in December is Breakfast with Santa at the Hayden Lake Fire Department on Sunday, December 14. Myron Richardson reports that they have purchased 400 pounds of sausage!

Weather permitting, there will be a January 1st Tour this year! John DeJong has a short, 30-mile tour planned. We will meet at Denny's in Spokane Valley and the tour will leave at 10:00. Denny's would not reserve space for us, but if you would like breakfast, come early.

Larry Mann will be hosting a Tour Planning Meeting in February to make plans for our 2026 tour season.

➡ **Sunshine:** Susie Carnegie said she had no news to report.

➡ **Name Tags:** Bill Barr has supplies available if you need a club name tag.

➡ **Refreshments:** Wanda Hummer has a table full of great treats tonight.

➡ **Wednesday Dinner:** Ralph Brevik has not been planning Wednesday Night Dinners, but this is something we are considering doing over the winter. If you have an idea for a place to have dinner on a Wednesday Night, contact Ralph and he will set it up.

➡ **Tuesday Night at Antique Auto Ranch:** Tom Carnegie reports that he is putting up a new 26x32 building, and has had a lot of help from a lot of people that he really appreciates to clearing space for it to be built.

➡ **Safety & Seminars:** Asked if he had anything to report, Mike Robinson replied, "No, thank you."

➡ **Old Business:** Nan Robison has our new club banner that includes contact information for our website and Facebook page. It will be attached to the bottom of our current banner.

In other old business, Mike Robison asked his mother to stand – John DeJong predicts Mike will be getting coal for Christmas.

➡ **Show & Tell:** Myron Richardson brought in an 1895 Montgomery Wards catalog. Things that we think are expensive now were selling for a nickel or a dime then. (But of course, a dime in 1895 had the buying power of almost \$4 today.)

➡ **Entertainment:** Tom Carnegie began by explaining the concept of a Talent Stack, which was developed by Scott Adams, writer and illustrator of the comic strip Dilbert. By learning to do many different, ordinary things as you go through life, your talents will stack up and you will do well because you will have developed a unique combination of talents that make you successful. Tom then treated us to a explanation of how a harmonica – or mouth organ, mouth harp, blues harp, French harp – is played by blowing air in and sucking air out, either through multiple holes or one at a time. He demonstrated with the song Old Susanna. If you want to play the blues, you create a bend by changing the shape of your mouth on the suck, not on the blow. He finished with a seasonal favorite – *O Christmas Tree*.

➡ **Tech Talk:** There was none.

➡ **For Sale:** Myron says he has all kinds of stuff for sale. Scott Colgove's son was experimenting with a new, advanced laser cutter and designed some Model T jewelry – pins, earrings, and pendants. Scott is making them available to the club for a suggested donation of \$10 each, which will be donated to the club.

➡ **New Projects:** Roy Moffit has his new engine, and just needs to put it in. He has found a place to store his car for the winter.

This is Larry Mann's last meeting as president, and he thanked everyone for putting up with him. He said we have a good replacement in John DeJong and 2026 should be a good year. The applause he received made it clear – we don't consider that we put up with him, perhaps he put up with us. Thank you, Larry!

Plans are of course weather dependent and we encourage you to monitor your email in case severe weather forces us to cancel this annual tour. —John DeJong

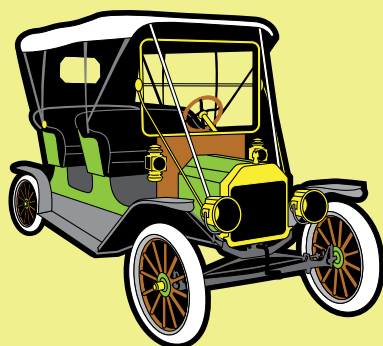
