Model T Family Memories

1925 Model T Story By Cheri Storey

In 1957 Vern Storey was a sophomore in high school and dating his now wife Cheri. His major dating auto was a 1930 Model A roadster, for which he paid \$175. At the time he was a member of the Crankers Horseless Carriage Club in Lewiston. In late 1957 one of the founding fathers of the Crankers Club (Bob Emerich) came to him and said you can no longer belong to the Crankers because your Model A is too new, but we have a solution for you. We will help you find parts of a Model T and with nothing but a part or two, you can continue your Cranker's membership. So off he went with Bob and several other Crankers members, scouting hay fields, old barns, junkyards and members' homes where multiple parts had been accumulated. He soon found the frame and other rusted body parts of a Model T in a hayfield, hauled it to his home where his dad said "no more cars around here."

You see, Vern had one other car, a 1948

Chevy and his brother, Gary, also had a Model A and a 1950 Chevy. These cars were in addition to his dad's family vehicle, a pickup and his stepmother's car. At that point Vern visited with Cheri's dad about the possibility of storing the Model T frame in his large garage. He agreed, and so then every weekend and other possible hours were spent in continuing to look for parts for his Model T. In 1958 enough parts had been accumulated that the frame held springs for the front seat, a gas tank, running boards, old wheels and tires and whatever else might be needed to make the "T fire up." Cheri's aunt & uncle and cousins were visiting from Seattle at her parents' home where Vern was working with a friend, getting ready to "fire up the Model T." (continued on page 6)

Also, we have broken down the car project by major systems. Just chose a link on the left for your area of interest.



Imagine the situation when her dad came running out of the house only to see lots of black smoke billowing out of his garage, but at last the "T had fired up" and soon the smoke disappeared and Vern and his friend went about ½ block for a ride before the car stopped

Dating hadn't come to a complete halt but had been severely interrupted on the weekends due to this wonderful new addition to Vern's life. He continued to collect parts until he graduated from high school in 1959 and trailored the T to his brother's barn in Cataldo, Idaho where it rested for nearly 8 years. Vern and Cheri were married in 1962, bought a home in 1964 and eventually after buying a washer & dryer, a bed, a table and chairs and other stuff folks need to set up housekeeping, brought the T home to their garage. A baby was added to the family in 1967 (Kent), so time and money were again a factor.

The goal for completion of the restoration of the 1925 Model T was the year of Expo 1974. Vern, Kent and Cheri had become members of the Inland Empire Chapter Model T Ford Club and were anxious to not only drive the car in the Lilac Parade in 1974 but also go on their first out-of-town convention, which was held in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Even though it was less than 30 miles away, they trailored to Coeur d'Alene and so began the many years of wonderful local and out-of-town touring, including a camping trip to Calgary in 1984. They pulled a small travel trailer for this adventure (named Model T RV) and were joined by a number of other Model T families.

The years also brought happy touring times along the Oregon Coast as far as Gold Beach, OR in 1986. The goal was to make it as far as the California Red Woods, but that wasn't to be. The 1925 broke down and arrangements were made to get it back to Wilsonville, OR where the Northwest Vintage Speedster Club was sponsoring a run. Vern and Cheri wanted to see what this "speedster craze" was all about so were able to be passengers for the Labor Day run. Vern then approached the IE Chapter to see if they might be willing to sponsor a run in Spokane and that was the beginning of the local chapter's sponsorship for this every-three-years event. Sadly Vern passed away in 1994 but left a legacy of fun-filled memories for remaining family members and lots of friends. **BY Cheri Storey**
