Minutes from the Last Club Meeting

March 3, 2017

President Mark Hutchinson called the meeting to order at 7:32 PM.

➡ **Welcoming committee:** There were no visitors, but we have two new members, Richard Hummer ('26 TT) and Myron Richardson ('24 Coupe).

➡ **Secretary's report:** A motion was made to approve the minutes from the February meeting as printed in the Fender Chatter. The motion was seconded and passed.

➡ **Sunshine report:** Susie Carnegie sent a sympathy card to the family of Ray Beale.

➡ **Vice President's report:** Jim Patterson didn't have any new information about the swap meet. He passed out new 2017 club rosters. Please contact him if you see any errors. Jim plans to make whatever corrections are needed. (Take a look at the great photo on the cover. It was taken in Shoup, Idaho, and features old gas pumps and speedsters.)

➡ **Tour chairman:** Nan Robison said that safety inspections will be on Sunday, May 21 at Larry and Norma Skidmore's home. Volunteers are needed to inspect cars or do other tasks. Everyone is welcome even if you don't have a Model T. We will again have a potluck and BBQ lunch. A motion was made to spend \$100 to buy meat for the BBQ. The motion was seconded and passed. Nan also said that her phone number is incorrect in the new club roster. Her correct phone is 701-4359.

➡ **Treasurer's report:** Betty Patterson reported that many members have paid their dues, and that we broke even on the club banquet in January. She said that club finances were in good shape. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the report.

➡ **Old business:** None.

➡ **New business:** The following things were discussed:
Board meeting report: Betty reported on the Board meeting that was held at Mark and Janice Hutchinson's home on February 24. Discussion focused on the 2017 budget. Proceeds from the swap meet help keep club finances in the black. Dues would otherwise have to be increased to about \$27 to cover expenses. Printed newsletters and postage are a big expense for the approximately 40 copies that are mailed each month. Four people have dropped their memberships this year.

Club byelaws specify that the spouses of deceased members can become life members, if they were a member for at least five years. The byelaws also say that a vote should be taken before someone can become a life member, though votes are rarely taken. Mark suggested that we consider revising that rule.

Betty reported that the club basically breaks even each year for income and expenses. This stimulated a discussion among members of ways that we might cut costs and raise income. We again discussed the \$236 annual cost for a mailbox, which had also been discussed at the January meeting. We could save about \$100 per year by renting a smaller box; however this would also change the address for mail that is received and sent by the club, which might be more trouble than it is worth. No action was taken on this issue.

Mike Robison had an idea that we could host a parade and car show—possibly at Liberty Lake. Mike has spent some time investigating the idea—which might raise some funds—but more work is needed to develop a plan.

Mike Stormo suggested an All Ford tour as another money-making idea. Mike said that we could invite members of all area Ford clubs. This could be an all-day tour with a dinner afterwards. Mike and Tom Carnegie will investigate this further, and hope that we can do the tour this year. They will report back to the club at a future meeting. More volunteers are needed. Contact Mike or Tom if you would like to help.

➡ **Audit of club finances:** Club byelaws require periodic audits of club finances. Bill Barr reported that he reviewed club finances, month by month, for the past three years. Bill said that everything looked good and that Treasurer Betty Patterson did an "A+ job."

A motion was made to leave as is the current names on tour accounts, to leave \$1,000 in the tour account, and keep the rest in the general account. The motion was seconded and passed.

➡ **Events this month:** Meet on St. Patrick's Day for dinner at Conley's restaurant in Spokane Valley to hear some good Irish music. The music group includes some of our own members. We will also meet for lunch in Reardan on Sunday, March 26 at 1:00. Afterwards, we might also visit the Inland Northwest Rail Museum that is just west of Reardan.

The meeting adjourned at 8:40 PM.

The next regular club meeting is April 7, 2017.







Above is shown the standard Ford Runabout with all-steel express type pickup body, 56" long, 40 $\frac{1}{4}$ " wide, 13" deep.

It is especially adapted for light duty work such as transporting tools and supplies, speedy delivery of parcels, produce, groceries, etc.
