Again this year, we're going to have the MTFCA 360 1:24 scale Model T races, and we have a great "Grand Prize" for the winner. Frank & Barbara Baker from Kennewick donated the 1st place trophy which is a valuable Jim Beam Model T collector's bottle, still sealed and full of well aged Jim Beam as shown in the attached photo!! Last year's winner, Norm Warren, has promised all a very challenging race this year, with some new tricks up his sleeve to help insure that he is not defeated by the amateurs!! For you novices, 1:24 scale is the size of the ERTL cast metal Model T banks (as shown in attached photo) available at many hardware stores or on the internet, EBay, etc.

The pine wood derby race cars used by the Cub Scouts are also the appropriate size and can be built up very reasonably to look like a Model T. The pine wood derby kits are available from Michael's Craft Store. The only criteria for all the racers is that they must be Model T in body style and the overall length must be approximately 5-1/2" long with about a 4" wheel base. Continued on page 2
