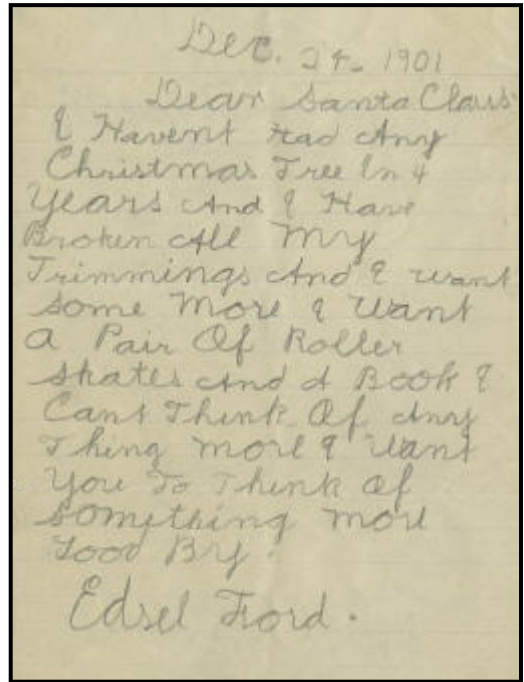
What happened?

Darrell won the drawing. Several nice bronze belt buckles that have Model T themes donated by Mrs. Palmer Knuteson were presented as runner up prizes.

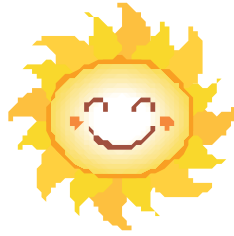

Greenfield Village

Betty & Jim recently returned from their first “post retirement” vacation, a trip back to the Upper Peninsula of Michigan to visit their daughter’s family. While back there, they visited the Henry Ford Museum, Greenfield Village, and the new Ford F-150 truck assembly plant on the site of the original River Rouge Ford assembly plant where Fords from the Model A through 1997 were built.

The following summary is about Greenfield Village. Henry Ford had a penchant for collecting unique artifacts that had significant effects on the world, and in the late teen years of the 20th century, he recognized that the American industrial revolution was the start of many new and burgeoning industries, including the automotive, electrical, aircraft, railroads, steel, rubber, chemicals, and petroleum industries. They were all participants of the “history in the making” phenomena raging through America and the best way to preserve these artifacts was to collect the beginning architecture of the first of these major inventions and placing them onto the grounds of the new “Henry Ford Museum”. In order to preserve the original birthplaces, schools, work places, and associated other structures of these famous inventors and scientists, and to preserve important part of American history, Henry developed “Greenfield Village”, a small but painstakingly accurate re-creation of the physical structures that played an important part in the American industrial revolution. Henry set out to purchase the actual historic structures and then relocated them to Greenfield Village, to be restored and preserved as they once stood.

Following are pictures and brief history of some of structures that Henry purchased and are now located in Greenfield Village in Dearborn, Michigan.

Thomas Edison's Menlo Park, NJ laboratory in 1876 where he invented the light bulb, phonograph, and 100's of other things. The soil actually came from the original plant site.



Greenfield Village also has Harvey Firestone's rubber laboratory, Edgar Rice Borough's scientific work on plant life laboratory, poet Robert Frost's home, George Washington Carver's soy bean research laboratory, H.J. Heinz's home, Wright brother's home, and much more.
