Suzie Stacey & Nan Robison each rebuilt a T Coil from scratch. After some puzzling difficulty & magical coil point modifications and adjustments, got them working at top performance. Thanks to the help & ideas from others we learned many of the trade secrets about T coils that very few Model T owners ever learn. The biggest "discovery" was learning how critical the .005" adjustment of the rivet on the top set of points is. If a coil buzzes but



no spark, either an internal wire is broken or the rivet gap is too large.

Everyone went home with good performing T coils and a smile on their face, and, more importantly, no one amused the participants by getting a 20,000 volt shock off the coil tester ! It was a fun event with lots of laughs. Nan even claimed that "her things" (meaning her coil points) weren't lined up. All the guys chimed in on that, asking hubby Dave if it was a true statement!! Dave smiled & remained quiet, wondering what she was referring to!

Many thanks go out to all the participants. Especially to Lee Burgess for hosting the seminar in his shop. It was a very successful seminar!

Here's the scoop on the annual banquet to be help at the Airport Ramada Inn at 6:00 PM starting with a nohost cocktail hour and the annual "MTFCA 384" (inches that is) Model T races. An Italian buffet dinner will be served at 7:00 PM with the grand champion races held immediately after dinner. A special surprise program will follow!

If you haven't yet purchased your banquet tickets, you can get them from Jim & Betty Patterson by mailing a check for \$20.00 per ticket to 11709 S. For you newer T Club members, the Model T car races are done with 1:24 scale ERTL brand Model T cast metal banks available at many toy stores (White Elephant, off EBAY, or from other T Club members. You can also go to Michael's Craft's and pick up a pine wood derby car and make one from scratch. The only requirement is that the model car must look like a Model T (any body style), be approximately 1:24 scale, and be totally gravity powered. We have a 32 foot track that we use for the competition, and as long as you keep winning your individual race heats, you keep moving up in the brackets. Attached are some pictures from last year, with Glen Whiteley, Norm & Virginia Warren, Alan McSweeny, Ada Bidle and Tom Carnegie being the big competitors. The wheel base on 1:24 scale models is about 4" axle-to-axle and the wheels are a little under 1-1/2" diameter, but as long as the cars are generally 1:24 scale, they will be allowed to particpate. We'll have some extra "un-certified" model cars available to "rent" if you don't have one, but it's a lot more fun to have your own and do "special" things to make them go faster (like lubricating the wheels, adding weight, and making sure they steer straight). This is the 4th year we've done this and it's really getting popular and very competitive.

We had over 20 participants last year and have room for as many as want to participate. So let's get those Model T racers tuned up and ready for the MTFCA 384!!

These cars were built for Allegheny as promotional and marketing projects. The top salesmen each year were given the honor of being able to drive them for one year.

The v-8 engine (max 85 hp) ran like a sewing machine and was surprisingly smooth and quite. FYI, the car was insured (we were told) for the trip to Louisville via covered trailer for 1.5 million dollars. We were also told that the dies were ruined by stamping the stainless car parts, making these the last of these cars ever produced.
