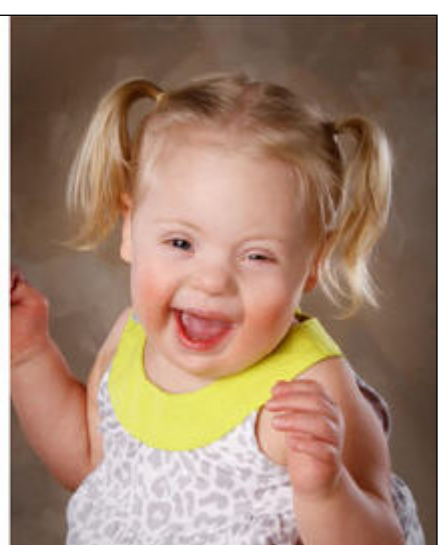

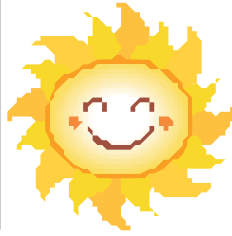

Remember Merrill Smith and his friend John from the Inland Car Club Council at our meeting last Friday evening? Merrill asked us to write to our legislatures to oppose changes to the rules concerning changes that allow number of parts cars on private property. Attached is a sample letter that Merrill has asked us to send out to our members.

Dear (insert name):

I am a concerned car hobbyist writing to let you know that the automobile collector and restoration hobby is a popular and community conscious group of individuals as well as organized clubs.

I have learned that changes to Legislation, introduced concerning ownership and storage of vehicles on private property for use in the car restoration and customizing hobby, will restrict the number and how these vehicles are stored on my own land.

The SEMA/SAN sponsored bill to allow the storage of vehicles for parts and restoration use has been altered and I would urge you to not vote for this change to the original SEMA action Network proposed bill.

In the original bill it was suggested that the number of cars used for the auto hobby be only controlled by a requirement to have them shielded from public view with a fence or hedge of some sort so the cars could not be seen by an individual standing at street level. Myself and my friends in the car related hobby feel strongly about this and we urge you as our elected representative to hear our concerns.
