Sprague, Tyler, & Edwall Tour Report

On a beautiful September Sunday, the club set out to see some little seen countryside and to visit Dave Thompson's collection of antique cars and trucks located in Sprague, WA. Dave has over 200 vehicles ranging from

the early 20;s through the 60's, with about 8 or 10 of them being Model T's. About 100 of his cars are located north of Spokane in an un-disclosed location. He's also got parts to dozens more Model T's, which he stores inside the ground floor of an old abandoned grain elevator. He has been selling a variety of Model T parts through EBAY and locally and has several complete



chassis as well as several complete cars – none of them restored at this time. The 13 Model T'er's participating in this tour also checked out a couple of truly authentic antique stores in downtown Sprague, finding a lot of automobilia and antique farm items to view.

Also taken in during the day was THE MAN CAVE, a small store located inside a container van in Tyler, WA. The van was full of automobilia including antique signs,

gas pumps, parking meters, license plates, and quite a bit more. Although very unorganized, the owner did have a quite a bit of interesting things, and he explained that his hobby-business does most of their sales

nationally through EBAY and Craig's list. He is really trying to develop it as a major hobbiest stop/museum. Both of these sites were quite interesting, but being out in the middle of wheat country and sagebrush, their customer base is very small, relying mostly on occasional vehicular traffic off nearby I-90.

Lastly, on the way home, we visited an authentic Model T dealership

building (*pictured*) that was operating through the Model T and Model A days in Edwall. WA. We took a considerable number of pictures of our Model T's on display in front of the well kept but vacant building. The building was most recently used until a few months ago for manufacturing throw-away 2 GB cardboard computer thumb drives to be used as give-aways at computer shows for sample software and advertising.
