September 22, 1911 Western Tour

This article comes from my boyhood hometown historical society newsletter in Berlin, Pennsylvania; <u>MEMOS</u>, <u>Berlin Area Historical Society, Summer 2008 Edition</u>. Berlin is located in the southwestern part of the state. If the name Shanksville rings a bell in this article it's where Flight 93, the fourth aircraft, crashed on 9/11/2001.

"B.F. Hinemeyer of Shanksville, who with his family returned from a western trip made in his model T Ford touring car, submits the following report of his trip: Total miles traveled, 4195; amount of gasoline used, 254 at a cost of \$45.72; amount of oil used, 19 ½ gallons, at a cost of \$11.70; the cost of repairs on the entire trip was \$1.85. Left home on May 3 and returned August 21. Same tires on the machine and look good for another trip.".
