

The meeting was called to order by President Jillian Robison at 7:35 PM at Lee & Candy Burgess' back yard. Thanks were given to the Burgess' for hosting the club's annual potluck picnic / meeting. The minutes for the June meeting were approved as printed in the Fender Chatter. There were no guests present.

Vice president Allan Stacey reported on the T Club's booth at the Spokane Swap Meet. There were several members' large Model T photographs on display which were provided by the Stacey's and a portable display case was provided by Eric Hutchinson for other photographs. In addition, the club's booth was located in a new central spot this year and everyone felt that the new look and location was very positive and attracted a lot of attention. Many thanks to the Stacey's and Eric for their hard work in designing and putting together the booth.

Treasurer's Report:

Bills were presented for \$33.23 for swap meet expenses; \$30.00 to Lee Burgess for hosting the potluck picnic / meeting; and \$383.52 for the 5-year registration of the Club's web-site domain name. Motion was made and seconded to pay the bills. Jim Patterson noted that there are only 40 hard black & white copies of the Fender Chatter now being mailed out monthly, the rest being emailed as color copies to over 60 members. This has dramatically reduced the costs of publishing and sending out the monthly newsletter.
