

October 3, 2014

Treasurer's Report:

Betty gave her treasurer's report. Our bank, Global, sent a letter that one of our accounts that we use for the occasional speedster run has not had any activity. If it doesn't have activity at least once every six months we have to pay \$10 dollars a month. After discussion motion was made for treasurer to write a \$5 dollar check from our savings account into the speedster fund and within the next six months write a \$5 check from the speedster fund back into the savings account. Motion was seconded and passed. Secretary suggests that this be set up as an automatic payment. Motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Treasurer's report.

Winners of the ticket sales were: Montana, and Montana again, and Joe.



(Spokane T Club Recipe Book circa 1990)

Spicy Apple Muffins - Joanne Jepperson

- 1/3 C Shortening
- 1/4 C Sugar
- 1 Egg
- 1 C Milk
- 3/4 Chopped Apple
- 2 C Flour
- 4 tsp Baking Powder
- 3/4 tsp Cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp Nutmeg

Combine dry ingredients and sift flour together. Cream shortening and add sugar - beat well. Add egg, then stir in milk and chopped apple. Add dry ingredients & stir just enough to blend, (do not beat). Fill greased muffin cups 2/3 full.

Bake in 400 degree oven for 20 to 25 minutes.


